Chris Riegert made a motion to approve the meeting agenda, David Merkle seconded and the agenda was approved.

Announcements:

Margaret announced that Skip Cox will be relocating to Greensboro. He will be greatly missed as the EAC liaison for the Beach Preservation Society and the Adopt to Highway program.

Matt Kirkland and Brady were unable to attend today's meeting. Brady will work on a presentation on the permitting process for the January meeting.

Staff Report: Scott Thornhall

Scott announced the possibility of hiring a new position which would be responsible for multiple roles including arborist.

Margaret asked about the Bradford pear removal program. Scott said there are about 7 to 8 sites prepared currently. Chris inquired what the EAC's role will be. Scott answered the care of the trees after planting. Carolina suggested recruiting neighbors. Sue mentioned the article in the newspaper has increased awareness. Margaret requested Carolina investigate how best to approach and recruit neighboring property owners to care for the new trees. David M suggested perhaps an official letter from the town.

Old Business

EAC Website: Allen Dearry

Allen provided updates on the website development. He suggested a deadline for feedback for the end of 2022. Allen also reiterated to members not share the link with anyone outside of the committee.

Lecture Series: Maureen, Sue

Although the contract with the 801 Event Center has not been signed, Matt advised moving forward with planning. Maureen will reach out to Michael Emory about advertising in The Current.

Skip the Straw Initiative/Resolution: Lee Maxwell

Lee reviewed material for the restaurant packet. Seaview printing has the material and is working on a more professional layout that should be available early January.

Sue mentioned many residents have read the newspaper article. Lee stressed that it was important to note that the initiative does not advocate any particular type of straw material. Lee also mentioned contacting the restaurants before the packets are delivered and also getting feedback to provide results for the town. Chris and Sue suggested sending an email to save paper.

Allen suggested approaching restaurants that already follow the ocean friendly guidelines as a reference for the talking points Sue also suggested getting data from those businesses as well.

Tree Ordinance

Margaret shared that the tree ordinance updates were on the planning board's agenda for today. However, Rick was not able to attend the meeting.

Chris commented that regardless of the outcome, it is a great list of native trees and plants and perhaps should be listed on the website.

David Merkle made a motion to support the tree ordinance updates that have been codified, Carolina seconded and the motion was approved.

Beach Preservation Society/Adopt a Highway: Skip Cox
