A stakeholders meeting was planned for early July to help draft a new Tree Ordinance. Finding the correct balance to ensure the rights of private property owners to develop their land while maintaining Oak Island's unique characteristics is challenging. These proposed text amendments (while not perfect) are a step in the right direction to preserving the island's tree canopy for future generations.

Planning has started on a series of (monthly) evening workshops relating to stormwater management. The workshops will take place November through February and will target developers, contractors, builders, and landscapers. The monthly workshops will be held at the 801 Building, and include a variety of speakers and topics. The Environmental Advisory Committee has been asked to help organize and participate in this stormwater educational effort.

The Stormwater Department is asking the Council to start a “Friends of Stormwater” recognition program for local businesses where innovative stormwater practices have been installed. These innovative practices may include pervious concrete, water harvesting, infiltration areas, pollinator plantings, living shorelines, and tree preservation. The program would allow Council to present an attractive placard to the business along with the business being recognized in the Current and local media outlets.
