The seventh month of 2023 was very successful in the planning and participation of events leading towards community involvement. The Department is building a stronger relationship with the community by hosting and attending multiple community events. A total of 59 new code case violations were processed and 63 case violations were closed. Unfounded violations remain low at only 4 for the month. In addition to the figures shown, CAMA/FEMA conducted 23 inspections, reviewed 23 plans, and conducted site visits for the month. Work without permit violations increased both opening and closing for the month. Multiple violation notices were issued, and numerous code case letters were mailed. Office consultations continue to increase. Plan review figure to the right represents all zoning plan review completed. Zoning Technicians continue to assist and educate the public with a variety of concerns to include uses for Town rights-of-way, acceptable sign posting locations, street ends usage, construction site maintenance, and permitted uses.

August 4, 2023 Stormwater Report for Council

Reported by Rick Patterson, Stormwater Administrator

Staff participated in several stakeholder meetings to develop a new Tree Ordinance ensuring the rights of private property owners to develop their land while maintaining Oak Island's unique tree canopy into the future. The stakeholder meetings were productive and educational.

Our first *Dune Infiltration* project (Barbee Street/ 801) got started on Tuesday (9/1) after a long delay waiting on materials. Project work started at the Barbee Street beach access were infiltration chambers will be placed underground with dunes reconstructed and planted overtop. Work around the 801 building will include roof-water management and positive drainage around the building. The two areas will be tied together along with catch basins and pumped into the underground infiltration /storage chambers were the stormwater will be filtered/cleaned passing through a stone/sand media and allowed to slowly infiltrate back into the groundwater system. The project is the first of several we have completed engineering designs on to help alleviate water ponding in these areas.

I completed an in-field training with EAC members discussing *Smart Yard* practices for older homes to reduce their stormwater footprints. The training also looked at how elements of the current and proposed new tree ordinances are and can be accomplished by Builders and landowners.

We completed a performance review of the Town's old 5-year MS4 permit by the NCDEQ Stormwater Section. The full review and field checks took place July 17-18 and entailed our complete Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) including authority to enforce and fund through ordinances, high & low density developments, illegal discharges, BMP structure reviews, violation tracking, needed GIS mapping updates, and others. The next step in this review is to provide NCDEQ with any additional requested documentation and to submit a new MS4 Application which is now ready for the Town Manager's review.
