Storm Response Recap



On **Friday, December 15**, the [**Severe Weather information**](#) page of the Town Website was activated, ahead of an intense low pressure system rapidly forming in the gulf of Mexico. This system quickly moved up the US East Coast, impacting the Cape Fear region on Sunday, December 17 with rough seas, strong winds, and torrential rainfall. In addition to activating the Severe Weather page, a total of three email and text alert notifications were sent through the [**OKInformation**](#) system.

As of Noon on Monday, December 18, Public Services crews had covered most of the public beach areas, performing [**debris cleanup**](#), resetting [**Mobi-mats**](#), and an initial assessment of [**beach conditions**](#). Although there was a significant amount of debris to cleanup, first observations were generally favorable for the beach conditions, with little-to-no damage reported throughout other parts of Town as well.

The Severe Weather Information page will most likely revert to "inactive" status later this week, however this serves as yet another reminder to be signed up for alert notifications from the [**OKInformation**](#) system. to sign up to receive your own notifications simply visit [**OakIslandNC.gov/WX**](#), or click the link below.

Town Council: Meeting Action Report

This past **Tuesday, December 12**, the Town council held their regular meeting. this was the final regular meeting of 2023, which also marked the first meeting for two new Councilmembers, Terri Cartner and Bob Ciullo.

The **Public Hearing** scheduled to start off the meeting was moved to the January 9, 2024 regular meeting. Following that, Council heard three **presentations**, approved two **committee appointments**, moved the one item of **old business** to the January 9, 2024 meeting.

After the old business item, the new and re-elected Councilmembers were sworn into office, where they then address four items of **new business**.

Assistant Chief of Police Receives FBI Trilogy Award

The Oak Island Police Department is proud to announce that **Assistant Chief of Police, Franklin D. Cooke**, has received the prestigious **FBI Trilogy Award**, after successfully graduating the programs provided by the **FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Association** (LEEDA).

Consisting of 120 hours of accredited training, the *FBI Trilogy* courses included comprehensive learning across three disciplines:

- **The Supervisor Leadership Institute (SLI)**
- **The Command Leadership Institute (CLI)**
- **The Executive Leadership Institute (ELI)**

The goal of these classes is to advance the science and art of law enforcement leadership, as well as to promote the exchange of information. This works to improve law enforcement management practices through training, education, and networking among police professionals across the United States and beyond.

Keep Pirates in the Past & Off Your Porch

Recent data shows that that 93% of shoppers will buy at least some of their holiday gifts online; and nearly half of ALL shoppers (47%) will buy exclusively online. While home delivery makes shopping convenient for you, it also makes things convenient for criminals.

This holiday season, the Oak Island Police Department reminds you to “keep pirates in the past & off your porch!”

Modern day “Porch Pirates” seize on the opportunity of easily-swiped packages right from your front steps, sometimes while you are even still inside your home! To help make sure your gifts end up in the right hands, remember to do things like:

- **Use “Delivery Instructions” to have packages left in a discreet or secure location**
- **Require a signature or (if possible) other means of remote verification**
- **Install motion activated security lighting**
- **Considering adding a doorbell camera**

Most importantly, remember to simply be a good neighbor. The holidays can be a stressful time, and delivery drivers are human too. Mistakes happen. With streets named by number AND direction here in Oak Island, we often see packages delivered to the wrong houses (ex: a “NE” address instead of “NW” street, etc.). Taking a few minutes to make sure an incorrectly delivered package gets to the right home, could make all the difference in someone else’s holiday. Even “Santa’s Helpers” need a little help sometimes!

FIRE DEPARTMENT

This Holiday Season: Stay Warm, Stay Safe!

While a "White Christmas" in Oak Island may refer more to sand than snow ... Winter is still right around the corner, and sending reminders every other weekend! Whether the cold comes in waves or settles in to stay, the Oak Island Fire Department would like to offer some important suggestions for home heating safety.

Space heaters, fire places, and other means of supplemental home heating are a great and economical way to help stay warm during the colder months. As with any heat source however, **they must be used cautiously**. When not given the proper respect and safety they can scald, burn, or destroy personal property. In the most severe of cases, they can even lead to fatalities!

When heating your home this winter, remember to:

- **Have the device or fireplace inspected annually to ensure they are operating optimally**
- **Never leave fires, space heaters, candles or other means of heat unattended**
- **Keep combustibles, pets, and kids 3-5 feet away from heat sources as these generate enough heat to burn, melt or ignite such items**
- **Be sure to verify that you use the right fuel for the right device**
- **Place heaters on a solid flat surface to prevent from tipping (most newer models can detect a tilt and safely disable the device, but it's always better to err on the side of caution!)**
- **Plug supplemental heaters directly into the outlet on the wall, and NOT with an extension cord**

Additionally, some great advice that's worth following all year long, is to regularly make sure your smoke detectors are functioning, and have fresh batteries. A "best practice" would be a simple test once a month, or at a minimum of twice a year. Adjusting clocks for daylight savings time can usually serve as a good reminder.

NOTICE: NEW Recreation Events Management Page

Anyone who has participated in the events and programs provided by the [**Oak Island Recreation Department**](#) is probably familiar with the **RecDesk** software.. For years, this software and the website managed by it, were the primary means of registering participants for various activities provided.

However, starting on **Monday, December 18, 2023** the Department has transitioned to a new software (and webpage), managed by [**Edmunds GovTech**](#).

After this date, all RecDesk accounts will no longer be active.

This new software is a significant upgrade, and allows the Recreation Department to have a more "complete site" - which is easier to navigate and improves the overall user experience.

All **daily / weekly** gym users or fitness class attendees should **NOT** notice any difference. **Monthly / yearly** members will have to create a new account. Currently active yearly or monthly **memberships will still be honored**, but a new account will need to be created. You can email Recreation Director, Heather O'Brien at hobrien@oakislandnc.gov to let her know you have created an account, and staff get your new card printed out.
