Town Manager Announces Retirement

On **Thursday, December 28, 2023**, during individual meetings with Town Councilmembers and administrative staff, **Oak Island Town Manager, David Kelly** announced that he would be **retiring** at the end of the fiscal year on **July 1, 2024**. A formal written notice will be provided to the Town Council later this week.

This exceeds the minimum four-month advance notice required by the Town Manager's contract, and will help to ensure stability throughout the remainder of the fiscal year, and the transition to a new manager.

David Kelly has been in public service for over 35 years, and working for Oak Island since 1992 when he joined the town of Yaupon Beach. In the late 90s, Mr. Kelly was instrumental in helping to navigate the merger of the towns of Yaupon Beach and Long Beach into what is today the Town of Oak Island. Following the merger, he served as Public Services Director until being named Town Manager in 2017.

Citizens Academy 2024: ENROLL NOW!

The **Oak Island Citizens Academy** is **BACK for 2024!** Classes for the popular learning program are scheduled to start on **Thursday, February 1, 2024**.

Citizens Academy is designed to educate and familiarize residents with the departments and services provided by their local government. Through hands-on learning and "in the field" demonstrations, Citizens Academy helps to provide a deeper understanding of the **"who, why, & how"** government works at the local level. The program also serves to encourage stronger participation in local government from residents of all interest levels.

Students will meet two (2) nights per week throughout the month of February, ending in a special dinner ceremony where they are presented with graduation certificates.

REMINDER: Grinding of the Greens Underway

If you celebrate Christmas with a natural tree and have just now started your "de-decoration," don't forget the Town's **"Grinding of the Greens"** program! The Public Works Department is currently collecting **natural Christmas trees** in the **Middleton Park Complex** parking lot at 4610 E Dolphin Drive.

The trees collected will be ground into mulch, for use in the Town's walking trails at the [Nature Center](#) and Recreation Center, as well as various other parks and Town properties. Trees **must be cleaned** of all non-vegetative decorations, lights, and ornaments. For those not wanting to participate in the Grinding of the Greens program, trees will still be collected from the right-of-way as part of the regular [Yard Debris Collection Schedule](#) but again, must be free of ornaments and decoration.

Whether participating in the the Grinding of the Greens or using streetside collection, be sure to dispose of your used Christmas trees properly, **using ONLY these two methods. Please DO NOT discard trees on the public beach areas, on the dunes, or in vacant lots.**

Don't "Curbside Advertise" to Thieves

The holidays are a wonderful time; and although they have much deeper religious and ceremonial meanings, the sheer amount of boxes left by the trash bins each January shows that **gift-giving** plays a big part as well.

While you may not think much of the boxes for your new laptop, TV, or other device, they can actually be an important - **and unwanted** - advertising tool for criminals. You may remember how we talked about avoiding "**Porch Pirates**" for gifts being delivered before the holidays. Well, it's the same principal for afterwards as well. Be cautious about the information you unintentionally give away about what's in your home, just by the boxes you leave out on the porch or by your bins.

Make sure to cut up and discard all boxes, so that they fit completely inside your recycling or garbage bins. Or better yet, take them to the Town's **Disposal Convenience Site** or one of the County's **Recycling Collection Centers**.

In any case, **DO NOT** leave boxes beside your bins in the streetside. Remember, collection is provided for the **bins only**. The Town's contracted service provider, **GFL Environmental, Inc** is not obligated to collect items placed in the right-of-way, or beside the bins.

A New Year's "Knox Box" Resolution

For most people, the New Year usually brings a host of "resolutions," usually aimed at improving ones health. When creating a personal health plan, people tend to overlook how much their home and belongings affect their health.

The Fire Department often receives calls for service that require them to "gain entry" into a home when searching for the cause of a fire alarm or other emergency notification. While our firefighters do enjoy using those axes, sledge hammers, and Halligans ... *a simple key is usually a lot quicker and much less destructive!* That's where having a **KNOX BOX** can assist in

protecting your home if there is a fire alarm or medical emergency!

The system consists of a sturdy, locked box (**pictured here**) mounted on the outside of your home, which contains your house key. This is similar to a "realtor's lockbox" with the main difference being that ONLY the Fire Department has access to this system.

FOR YOUR SECURITY: Only the Oak Island Fire Department has a key specific to open the Knox Boxes sold in our response area. Keys from other departments WILL NOT open Knox Boxes sold for Oak Island.

The Fire Department electronically tracks each time the Knox Box key is removed from a firetruck.
