

Town Council Meeting Review & Retreat Notice

Last Wednesday, January 17 held a PACKED schedule for the Town Council. Starting at 9:00 AM, the Council held the first day of the Annual Retreat, with a full agenda dedicated to kicking off the budget process for the upcoming fiscal year. Councilmembers new and returning heard a complete overview of the Budget, a full debt review, and current and anticipated capital projects. Additionally, the Council received a comprehensive presentation on Beach Nourishment & Management from contracted engineer, Moffat & Nichol.

Later on Wednesday, the Town Council came back together at 6:00 PM for their regularly monthly meeting. Lasting over 5 hours, this first regular meeting of 2024 had been rescheduled from January 9 due to inclement weather. This meeting contained several major topics of interest, including Amendments to Chapter 32 of the Code of Ordinances regarding trees & vegetation, as well as Paid Parking, and other topics mentioned later in this edition.

The Town Council will continue with **Day 2** of the Annual Retreat this Wednesday, January 24, 2024 at **9:00 AM**. This second meeting agenda is centered around a "work-session" approach, as Council will address major points of concern for the coming months ahead, such as new Town Manager recruitment and priority goals / targets for the Fiscal Year 2024-2'

Paid Parking Infrastructure Assessment RFP

Approved by the Town Council during their regular meeting last Wednesday, a Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued late last week for a **Paid Parking Infrastructure Assessment**. The RFP seeks assistance from qualified, professional Traffic Engineers to perform evaluations on the Town's physical infrastructure for paid parking. The firm awarded this contract will have the primary responsibility of developing the assessment document and will work in coordination with the Town of Oak Island's Public Works Department.

Throughout the process, the selected firm will be expected to utilize their experience and drive the process to produce an assessment within 90 days of approval of a contract. To achieve this goal, and utilize the experience of the selected firm, Oak Island will require the expectations outlined in the RFP Information Packet to be met and identified within the firm's proposal.

The Due Date for all submissions is Friday, February 2, 2024 at 4:30 PM.

Paid Parking: 2024: Terms Used

As was widely publicized last week, the Town Council approved the revised **Service Agreement** with **Otto Connect** for the **2024 Paid Parking Season**. This enacted several updates for the 2024; and while these updates were immediately posted on the Parking Information page, they still prompted a few calls and emails for clarification.

For those new to the program, or anyone needing a brief refresher, below are reminders on the terms used:

- **TOWN PARKING PERMITS** are provided exclusively to Town Residents & Property owners, and allow for parking in BOTH "Town Reserved" and regular Paid Parking spaces. There is a limit of three (3) permits, at a cost of \$10 each. As of this publication, **an initial sales date has NOT been set for 2024. HOWEVER**, unlike other permit types, Town Permits are **NOT limited in total quantity** and **there is NO "cut-off" date** for sales. So there is no need to rush on purchasing your Town Parking Permits, so long as they are in effect by the start of the Season on **April 1, 2024**.
- **SEASON PARKING PERMITS** are available for anyone to purchase at a cost of \$175, and allow for parking in regular Paid Parking spaces only. The total number of Season Permits for 2024 has been increased to 1,500, and sales will begin on **Saturday, February 3, 2024 at 9:00 AM**.
- **NEW: BULK SEASON PERMITS** will be available for businesses or individuals wanting to purchase more than four (4) Season Permits. These Bulk Permits will be available in **March, 2024** (specific date to be determined separately) at a rate for \$175 for Permits 1-4, increasing to \$325 for Permits of 5 and higher.

Street Paving Services Requested

During their regular meeting this past **Wednesday January 17**, Council unanimously approved a **Budget Amendment** to move the funds from parking revenue to the appropriate Public Works fund for street paving. Additionally Council also approved the release of a **Request for Proposals**, inviting sealed bids for paving and resurfacing services.

Once the RFP has been published and all bids received, options will be presented back to the Town Council to award a contract. These actions look to restart the stalled and much-anticipated street paving schedule within the remaining fiscal year.

Pier Repairs Approved

For many, Winter isn't thought of as a "busy season" for the tourism industry. However, just because there is a lack of visitors doesn't mean there is a lack of activity. The quiet, colder months offer a great opportunity for much needed improvements and repairs, and the **Oak Island Pier Complex** is no exception.

There are several repairs needed in the leased restaurant spaces of the Oak Island Pier House which the Town has had an engineer review and provide recommendations for. Noted repairs include the kitchen floor and the storage area floor in the restaurant portion, the floor area behind the counter in the coffee house, and additional deck areas for ingress and egress.

During their **Wednesday, January 17** meeting, Town Council unanimously approved a Budget Amendment to accommodate these facility repairs, **not-to-exceed \$125,000**.

SAFETY BRIEF



FIRE DEPARTMENT: Cold Weather Precautions

Happy January, and welcome to the heart of Winter! The frigid nights already experienced, and those that lie ahead offer a great opportunity for reminders on common cold-weather hazards.

If utilizing a **space heater**, please do so with caution. Make sure that there is an ample amount of clearance around the heater, usually around the 3-foot range. These do get hot enough to ignite materials that may be in the immediate vicinity. If possible, try to use a newer version, as they have built-in safety features that shut them off if accidentally knocked over. To avoid those tripping hazards, try to keep the cords away from high-traffic areas. **DO NOT** leave these unattended, and be sure to unplug them when not in use. And when you do plug them in, do so directly, avoiding powerstrips and overloaded outlets.

If using any type of **gas appliance**, we always recommend that a working **Carbon Monoxide Detector** is in place . home. These should be situated closer to ground level since the CO will be heavier than the air pulling it to the ground.

Finally, don't forget the common problem that **freezing pipes** with these chilly temperatures can lead to ruptured water lines. Leave a faucet dripping to keep the water moving and prevent freezing up. This may cause a slight inconvenience on the water bill but is A LOT cheaper than replacing busted lines or repairing flood damage. **In the event that your lines do rupture CALL 9-1-1** to be connected with the appropriate resources. If you do have water lines or gas lines exposed to the elements, cover them up with insulating wrap to.

POLICE DEPARTMENT: Keep the Lights On for Safety

One Winter activity almost no one enjoys is **car repair**. However, there's one simple, usually easy fix that is VERY important to do, no matter the season. We're talking about **taillights**, and it's an issue we've been noticing more of lately.

Whether it's cars driving at night without taillights, or enclosed utility trailers without working brake lights, making sure those behind you can see your vehicle and your stopping or turning actions is extremely important. If driving without proper lighting a citation could be the least of your worries, you could be placing the lives of you, your family, or fellow motorists at risk.

That is why it is good practice at least once a week to check the lights all around your vehicle; and for services trades and contractors pulling trailers, lighting should be checked daily! It may seem silly at first, but it is critical to familiarize yourself with how your vehicle's lighting system works. Just because you may have "daytime" running lights, you might still need to manually turn on your full lights at night. And even if you have fully automatic lighting, **do you immediately know how to turn them on in an emergency if they're off?**

Don't be lulled into a false sense of security by the automatic conveniences of modern autos, take charge and know how to make sure you are safe ... *and seen!*

The Program is open to all fallen, retired, and active members of all branches of the military, with a cost for each banner of \$70.00 (there is no fee collected unless the applicant is selected).

 - Memorial Day
 - July 4th
 - Labor Day
- Flags will be installed in Veterans Park on September 11 and Veterans Day
