Program Update: Parking Decals

During their regular meeting on **February 13, 2024**, the Town Council decided that **physical Parking Decals will NOT be issued for 2024.**

Alternatively, enforcement of resident-only parking spaces by the contracted vendor Otto Connect **will be extended** into the Paid Parking afterhours of **5:00 PM - 9:00 PM**.

Please note, this does NOT affect the hours for Paid Parking, which will remain from 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM daily. Restarting the Decal Program may be evaluated for future use at a later date, at which point public notices will be published.

To review, in 2024 only **Town Parking Permits** will be in use, which are virtually identified through the registration of a vehicle's license plate, and monitored by the contracted parking services provider, Otto Connect.

NCDOT: Bridge Sweeping Operations This Week

Throughout this week, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) will be performing **Bridge Sweeping Operations** on BOTH the **G.V. Barbee** and **Swains Cut Bridges**.

Currently, operations are not set for a specific night, and will occur as conditions and crew availability allows. This will be a "rolling operation" that will take place in the overnight hours, between **9:00 PM – 5:00 AM, Monday - Thursday.**

No bridge closures are expected, and traffic impacts should be minimal. However, please be aware of the possibility for slight delays and the presence of slow-moving crews during the overnight hours, and plan travel accordingly and stay alert.

Oak Island Pier: Schedule Change

One of the most welcome signs of spring is found in the added sunshine afforded by **Daylight Saving Time**. For many, this means more time to spend outdoors at their favorite locations; and a favorite location for **anglers** from all over is the **Oak Island Pier**.

NOTICE: As of **Monday, February 19**, the Oak Island Pier & Pier House is now operating on its **Spring Schedule** from 7:00 AM - 7:00 PM daily.

Although it's a few weeks ahead of the official start of Spring, by the time the clocks "**spring forward**" on **Sunday, March 10**, the Pier & Pier House will have already been enjoying the ever minute of the growing daylight hours! The next schedule change should come in late April with a switch to the Summer Schedule of 6:00 AM - 10:00 PM.

In addition to fishing passes, the Pier House is conveniently stocked with frozen bait, fishing tackle, sundries, snacks, ice cream, and drinks for purchase. Shirts, sunglasses, and other souvenirs are also available.

"Living Shoreline" Cleanup Events Announced

Last week, the **Environmental Advisory Committee** (EAC) announced the 2024 dates for the popular ***Living Shoreline Cleanup*** events:

- **MARCH 9 • NOON - 2:00 PM**
- **MAY 4 • 10:30 AM - NOON**
- **SEPTEMBER 21 • 4:30 PM - 6:00 PM**
- **NOVEMBER 16 • 1:30 PM - 3:30 PM**

Plan to join the EAC and like-minded individuals as they clean-up marine debris from the marsh area and living shoreline at **Oak Island Veterans Park**, located at the corner of E Yacht Drive & NE 15th street.

Volunteers should wear sturdy, ideally waterproof knee-high boots and dress for the weather. Expect to get a bit wet and muddy! Bring work gloves if you have them, but extras will be available, and don't forget your water bottle! No special skills are necessary, just a willingness to help out.

POLICE DEPARTMENT: Traffic Plan for Mardi Gras Parade

It's one of the most anticipated events of the year, and the "unofficial" kickoff to Spring in Oak Island, the [Mardi Gras By the Sea Festival & Parade](#). While the Festival at Middleton Park starts at **NOON**, this year's Parade looks to be the biggest (*and longest*) yet, with over 40 registered entries!

As always, the Police Department will be working hard to ensure everyone has a safe and enjoyable time, whether you are a parade participant, spectator, or motorist just passing through!

Please take note and share the following **Street Closures & Detour** information! From **1:00 PM - 3:00 PM** this **Saturday, February 23, 2024** the Department will **CLOSE** East Oak Island Drive, from **Trott Street** to **46th Street**, to accommodate the [Mardi Gras Parade](#). A **DETOUR** route will be established along Elizabeth Drive and E Yacht Drive.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: Beach Bonfire Safety Reminders

With the [Mardi Gras By the Sea Festival & Parade](#) and potentially favorable weather, it's shaping up to be a fun and busy weekend. That also means more people doing fair-weather activities ... such as **Beach Bonfires!**

It's hard to believe, but Winter will soon be over. With Sea Turtle Nesting Season right around the corner bringing an end to Beach Bonfire Season, we thought it would be a good reminder of some important safety information, as there are still several weeks left in the season.

Remember, a [Beach Bonfire Permit](#) is **REQUIRED** before any bonfire can be conducted. Permits are **FREE** to submit online, and simply provide the Fire Department with a record of when and where to expect open flames on the public beach areas.

Additionally, remember to keep safety a top priority!

- **Do NOT** conduct bonfires in the Emergency Vehicle Paths or on any sand dunes.

- Make sure the **flame size** stays about 4 feet in diameter or smaller.
- **Do NOT** burn yard debris, trash, or any materials other then dried firewood.
- Be sure to **clean up your site**; with all burned materials cooled and completely removed from the beach (DO NOT bury materials in the sand)

Finally, remember that if at any point windspeeds exceed **15 MPH**, all permits will be effectively CANCELLED until windspeeds lower.
