Meet Austin Alfonso and Alexis Oxendine! Owners of Koko Cabana and other popular establishments Kai Joe's, Ruby's Coffeehouse and Eatery, Fizzy Jane's, and Café Koa, this couple's journey is a testament to passion, resilience, and community spirit.

Austin, originally from Boiling Spring Lakes, and Alexis, hailing from Pinehurst, have always been drawn to the kitchen. Their culinary adventure took a significant turn in their early 20s when they moved to Hawaii. It was there that they fell in love with the unique flavors and techniques of Hawaiian cuisine, an experience that would later shape their entrepreneurial vision.

Returning to the Oak Island area in 2016, they seized an opportunity to rent a space soon to be known as Kai Joe's. Their concept and experience quickly set them apart, leading them to be chosen from numerous applicants for the unique restaurant space in Oak Island. Starting on a shoestring budget financed through credit cards, the duo ran the restaurant with no other employees for the first four months, a true testament to their dedication and hard work.

In 2019, tragedy struck with a kitchen fire at Kai Joe's, but the adversity only brought the team and the community closer. With overwhelming support from the community, Austin and Alexis were able to open Koko Cabana, a concept modeled after their time in Hawaii. At Koko Cabana, almost everything is made fresh from scratch, reflecting their commitment to quality and authenticity.



What's truly rewarding for Austin and Alexis is the palpable desire from both customers and staff for their success. This mutual support extends beyond the confines of their eateries, as they actively give back to the community - supporting families in need, schools, and local charities.


Koko Cabana opens for the season on Friday, March 1
