CLOSURE NOTICE: Pickleball & Tennis Court Resurfacing

Beginning at **SUNSET** on **Sunday, March 10**, the **Pickleball & Tennis** courts will be **CLOSED** until further notice.

This closure is to accommodate **resurfacing** of the courts, which will also include the **conversion** of one Tennis court to 6 Pickleball courts.

Town Manager Receives Regional Impact Award

This past **Thursday, February 29, 2024**, Town Manager David Kelly was presented with the **2024 Local Government Regional Impact Award** from the **Cape Fear Council of Governments** (CFCOG).

The award was presented at the CFCOG's annual banquet, held in Supply, "In grateful recognition of the outstanding dedication and contributions to the people of the Cape Fear Region" and signed by Brunswick County Commissioner Chairman Mike Forte, and GFCOG Executive Director Allen Serkin.

The Cape Fear Council of Governments is composed of the 44 municipal and county governments in Brunswick, Columbus, New Hanover, and Pender Counties. The CFCOG plans and administers a variety of federal, state, and local programs covering the areas served; ensuring a cooperative relationship with both the public and private sectors.

Successful Public Input Sessions

Speaking of the Town Manager, David Kelly is set to retire at the end of the current fiscal year on July 1. One of the main responsibilities of the Town Council is the recruitment and selection of a new Town Manager. On Wednesday and Saturday of last week, the public was invited to participate in that process through a series of **Public Input Sessions**, which were announced earlier in February through a letter from Mayor Liz White.

Held in the Council Chambers on the second floor of Town Hall, a total of seven (7) sessions were held, with three public sessions on Wednesday, February 28 and two more on Saturday, March 2. Two sessions for Town Staff were held on Friday, March 1. The sessions provided an in-person overview of the roles and responsibilities of the Town Manager, and how the role interacts with Town Council. They gave participants a chance to speak on what they think the Council should look for hiring for the position.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: A Pleasant Polar Plunge

The Fire Department was excited to provide support for the 2024 Brunswick County Special Olympics Polar Plunge this past weekend, which was held at the SE 49th Street Beach Access Location.

Although quite foggy, the conditions weren't too "polar" as the event drew hundreds of spectators, plungers, and donors, raising nearly \$30,000 to support Special Olympics athletes across Brunswick County.

The Fire Department had two rescue swimmers in the water to assist plungers, along with four (4) EMT's standing by for medical support, if needed. Our support efforts worked seamlessly with the Oak Island Police Department, Brunswick County EMS, and Oak Island Water Rescue.
