

Town Council Meeting Agenda Preview

The Oak Island Town Council will hold its regular monthly meeting **tomorrow, March 12 at 6:00 PM** in Council Chambers, on the second floor of Town Hall at 4601 E. Oak Island Drive.

The meeting will begin with a **Public Hearing** on a Special Use Permit for a hotel in the Commercial Recreational (CR) zoning district located at 1425 E Beach Dr. **NOTE:** The applicant has requested a continuance of the hearing until April 9, 2024. This will be followed by a **Presentation** on the **Brunswick County Recycling Program**.

There are two (2) **Committee Appointments** for the Board of Adjustments (two regular terms ending March 2027) and an appointment to the Recreation Advisory Board.

Old Business contains four (4) items, including consideration of a contract for repairs to the Davis Canal Pedestrian Walkover at SE 9th Street, along with awarding the contract for Street Paving, consideration of amendments to Section 32-76.1(b)(1) of the Town's Code of Ordinances (Tree & vegetation guidelines), and a Water Tower Lease for Verizon.

New Business will see two (2) items, including consideration of a Request for Encroachment Agreement, and consideration of Amendment to Section 28-42(d)(d) (Parking prohibited on public streets and rights-of-way). A **Closed Session** is also scheduled for this meeting.

Construction Update: Davis Canal Pedestrian Walkway

As of **Monday, March 11, 2024**, construction is wrapping up on the **Davis Canal Pedestrian Walkover** which connects **SE 20th St & 19th Place E**.

IMPORTANT: While construction has finished, the Walkway is still CLOSED until further notice.

Some remaining site cleanup and structural inspections are needed before an official opening can take place. In the meantime, please **stay off** the Walkway until notice is officially given through the **OKInformation** email system.

Completion of this project comes after three months of work to replace the arched northern section of the walkway, closest to SE 20th Street. This area was not part of the repairs in 2021 following Hurricane Isaias, and required a complete demolition and reconstruction to address structural and safety concerns. The work was performed by *Evans & Sons Contracting* and *McPherson Marine*, with contracts administered by the Town's Public Works Department.

Pending contract approval by the Town Council, a similar project will begin soon on the Davis Canal Pedestrian Walkover which connects **SE 9th St & 9th Pl E**.

Public WORKS: Leaf Truck Troubles

"**Where's the leaf collection truck!?!?**" It's a question the Public Works Department commonly (*and sometimes not-so-politely*) receives. The Town of Oak Island operates 25 Cubic Yard Vacuum Collection units as part of its **Yard Debris Collection** schedule. Usually the truck has no problem staying on schedule, so long as that schedule is spent collecting **JUST** leaves. Unfortunately, that is often not the case.

As seen by **THIS PILE OF DEBRIS** collected over a single 5-day period, there is a lot more than just leaves being left in the right-of-way. These items get sucked into the machine, and can cause extreme amounts of damage. Damage which results in equipment downtime, costly repairs, a delayed collection schedule, and ultimately costs that are passed on to taxpaying residents.

Whether it's damages like **snapped welds in a bell housing** (a \$3000 repair), or **cracked impeller blades** hit by bricks, rocks, or similar hard objects, these "hidden surprises" in leaf piles affect everyone through unit downtime. In the 2023-24 Fiscal Year, **the Town had to replace the liners and/or impellers in these machines 13 times**, something that should normally only happen about once a year.

HOW CAN YOU HELP: Take a few extra moments when placing your yard debris beside the street for collection, and make sure there are no large branches, rocks, stones, bricks, or other hard debris mixed in. While waiting for collection, if you notice any of these items make their way into your pile, be sure to pick them out and place them where they belong.

These simple actions of good stewardship are the true mark of a caring community, Not doing something because *you have to*, but because your small efforts can (and will) make a big difference for everyone further down the line.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: A Special Smoke Alarm Install

The time shift during Daylight Saving Time offers a great reminder to check and replace the batteries in your smoke alarms, *something we can assist with, if needed*. In fact, this past **Friday, March 8**, we assisted with installing several smoke alarms which uniquely feature an LED strobe light as visual aid for the deaf / hard of hearing. This need became known during a previous response, in which our staff learned of a deaf resident who did not currently have these in their home.

Needless to say, these types of alarms are a **critical resource** for those who may not be served by traditional "sound-only" alarms, and one we were honored to be able to help provide. Captain David Loving reached out to **Stop Loss LLC** who through a partnership with **Better Beach Rentals** were able to provide and install these life-saving devices!

As noted in [a video we shared on our Facebook page](#), **smoke alarms save lives**, which is why there are alarm options to meet a wide variety of needs. If you have special medical concerns, don't think you have to compromise on your level of protection.

As a "community oriented" policing model, it does not get more ingrained into the community through this level of service. For many of the attendees, the Community Center is their primary source of social interaction, and their **only** opportunity to meet our officers in a non-emergency setting. If you have a fall or other medical emergency, or worse are the victim of a crime, having a familiar face show up in your time of need is one of the greatest assurances you can have that everything will be okay.
