**Tees**—Also showing signs of spring green-up growth. Have been mowing more frequently, will also treat with same product as soon as it is available on the market.

**Ponds**—Carolina Pond & Stormwater remains on schedule with site visits keeping the water as clean as possible with any herbicide treatments required.

**Rough**—Pre-emerge application was made near the end of February. Will continue to spot-mow any weeds that continue to grow and will keep debris cleared from area of play.

**Sand Traps**—Edging project started late February and was completed by the end of the month. Keeping weeds in check with periodic spot-applications of herbicide.

**Irrigation**— Technician was onsite February 27<sup>th</sup> responding to a call about the vacuum pump. While in the process of cleaning/repairing he recommended we go ahead and perform a system service, which he completed the same day.

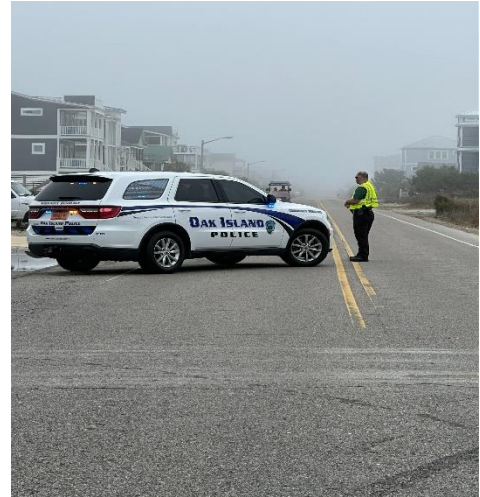
