Nuclear Siren Test

This **Wednesday, April 10, 2024** between **10:00 AM - 11:00 AM**, Duke Energy and county officials will conduct a **full volume, 3-minute test** of the sirens around the Brunswick Nuclear Plant.

No public action required. The 38 sirens within 10 miles of the Brunswick Nuclear Plant will sound for 5 to 30 seconds. To ensure they are functioning properly, it may be necessary to test some sirens more than once. Testing is performed in cooperation with emergency officials in Brunswick and New Hanover counties, who are responsible for sounding the sirens.

Budget Workshops Continue

This past week, the Town Council kicked off their annual **Budget Workshops** with special meetings on **Tuesday, April 2** and **Thursday, April 4**. Usually held in May, these special meetings offer an informal, "workshop style" setting, where the Council meets with the Town Manager, Finance Director, and department heads to help provide direction in forming the Town Budget for the coming fiscal year. This further builds upon the "ground level" work the Council sets during their "Annual Retreat" in January.

Last Tuesday's meeting provided a general overview of the work ahead, and addressed budgeting within Administration and Recreation departments. Thursday looked at funding for Emergency Services, with the Fire and Police departments. The upcoming meeting this week will look at Development Services and Public Works.

Paid Parking Reminders

Last week the **Paid Parking** program began for the 2024 season, which is enforced from **April 1 - September 30**, between the hours of **9:00 AM - 5:00 PM**.

As a reminder, both temporary Parking Permits and Resident Permits are **NOT** being sold in-person at the Town Hall for 2024. While the Customer Service Desk staff can assist with providing your Utility Account Number (used to obtain a Resident Permit), they cannot assist with Permit purchases, ticket information, or citation disputes.

Citation payments or disputes can be handled by directly contacting the parking services vendor, **Otto Connect** at surfcast@ottoconnect.us or by phone at **910-200-1497**.

Permit purchase information, as well as all other details related to the program, is available on the ***Parking Information*** page of the Town Website. This is the **ONLY official source** of program information from the Town, and is updated regularly with any developments as needed.

Courts Cleared to Reopen

This past Friday, April 5, the Public Works Department gave an update to the resurfacing work being performed on the Pickleball & Tennis courts located in the Middleton Park Complex (behind Town Hall).

As ***pictured in this editions cover photo***, a majority of all work has been completed, and the north pickleball court (closest to the Town Hall) was officially **REOPENED** on **Friday, April 5**.

Only minor work is needed to finish the remaining courts, which should be reopenned soon. Work is being performed by **Carolina Sport Court**, which includes full resurfacing of all courts and the conversion of one tennis area into 6 pickleball courts.

POLICE DEPARTMENT: Chief's Letter To LSV Rental Companies

While Memorial Day weekend in May is traditionally viewed as the start of the summer tourist season, for all practical purposes in Oak Island, the Easter holiday weekend is the true kickoff. With the influx of our weekly guests, comes a rise in one of the most popular ways to get around town; rented **Low Speed Vehicles** (LSVs).

In April of 2023 we redesigned and reissued our popular **Low Speed Vehicle Info-cards**, which provide a handy "quick reference" on the rules expectations for LSV use within the community. Also for the first time ever, Chief Morris sent out to a letter to all known LSV rental companies, which included copies of the info-cards and a strong urging to provide them to ALL of their customers.

Once again for 2024, the Chief will be sending out an **LSV Rental Business Letter** updated for 2024, along with the info-cards. By working together with business owners and operators to provide this information to their customers, we can help to ensure a safe and enjoyable summer for everyone.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: Red Flag Response Rate

This past **Monday, April 1** marked the start of the **Beach Warning Flag** forecasts from the **National Weather Service (NWS)**; and unfortunately it didn't take long to see just how vital this resource can be. During that first week of forecasting, we experienced **three straight days** of **RED FLAG** conditions.

Through the Town's email and emergency text alert system, **OKInformation** over **22,200 email and text alerts** were sent to our subscribers in those 3 days alone, all with an over **99% delivery success** rate!

Such a high delivery success rate is an amazing accomplishment, and is a testament to how connected and engaged our subscribers are. However, we know that eventually, the call to rescue someone in distress will come ... *and we will be ready!*
