25th Anniversary Events Page

In case you haven't heard, **July 1** marks the **Town's Birthday** (celebrated as "**Beach Day**"); and if you're counting, 2024 marks **25 Years** since the Town's Charter was first recognized on July 1, 1999. During the Town Council's regular meeting on **Tuesday, June 18**, Mayor Liz White officially announced the **25th Anniversary Calendar of Events**.

Kicking off with a Celebration Event at the Amphitheater stage on July 1, the calendar celebrates our Silver Anniversary with events packed all the way up until the end of the calendar year.

In addition, the Mayor also unveiled new promotional items to commemorate the occasion, including custom light po^s and a special Anniversary Challenge Coin.

Life Saving Award Presented

On **May 16, 2024** the **Oak Island Fire Department** and **UAS Division** achieved the first successful field deployment of life-saving rescue tubes, launched from a drone. This marked the transition from using drones as a **passive rescue tool** for observation and location, to an **active rescue tool** capable of delivering physical assistance to swimmer in distress.



This response caught the attention of not only the local community, but audiences across the state and even nation. During the June 18 Town Council meeting, **Blue Ridge Mountain Drones** presented Oak Island Fire Chief Lee Price a UAS Pilot Shawn Barry, with a letter of appreciation for the life-saving use of drone technology. In addition to the letter from Owner and Chief Pilot Wayne Bailey, Blue Ridge Mountain Drones also provided a sizeable donation to help further fund the Town's drone program.

Blue Ridge Mountain Drones provides classes to meet the FAA Part 107 rules, and specializes in NFPA 2400 Standard for Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems.

Beach Nourishment Grant Approved

Last week, on **Monday, June 17**, Town Manager David Kelly was notified by the Division of Water Resources (DWR) of the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ), that **\$440,000** in financial assistance had been tentatively approved by the State for the Town's Dune Planting Project.

The award comes as the result of a grant application made by the Town in 2023, and provides funds for "costs associated with beach nourishment, artificial dunes, and other projects to mitigate or remediate coastal storm damage to the ocean beaches and dune systems of the State" as noted in the letter.

The next upcoming Beach Nourishment Project is scheduled to take place in the winter of 2024 / 2025. Nourishment efforts are typically performed during the winter or early spring months to avoid Sea turtle Nesting, and minimize impacts during the summer tourist times.

Parking Assessment RFQ

The Town of Oak Island is **seeking qualifications** from professional **Traffic Engineers** who will assist the Town in evaluating the physical infrastructure for paid parking. The firm awarded this contract will have the primary responsibility of developing the assessment document and will work in coordination with the Town of Oak Island's Public Works Department.

Throughout the process, the selected firm will be expected to utilize their experience and drive the process to produce an assessment before December 31, 2024. SPECIAL JOINT MESSAGE: Fireworks Safety

From the Desks of Police Chief Charlie Morris & Fire Chief Lee Price:

While the first week in July is spent celebrating the birth of both our nation (July 4) and our Town (July 1), one thing that isn't fun or celebrated is the extra resources, overtime, and reporting we use up responding to ***home use of FIREWORKS..***

That's why we're kicking off the summer celebrations with a serious discussion on ***Fireworks Safety*** ... for **YOU**, for **YOUR HOME**, and for **YOUR NEIGHBORS**.

Remember that anything with a flame or spark can be a potential fire, especially in the dry conditions we've been experiencing lately. While **NC General Statutes 14-410 & 414** prohibit "explosive or aerial fireworks" [EDIT: This means they are illegal, so **DO NOT** use them!] such as roman candles or rockets, smaller permitted products like firecrackers and sparklers can still burn at temperatures of **up to 2,000° F**.

Never let kids play unattended with these items, and always take necessary precautions to ensure your own personal safety. Also, please (and we can't say this enough, it seems) **DO NOT operate any product or device while under the influence of drugs or alcohol!**

Also consider the safety of your home. If you're knowledge of operating an aerial firework is simply "***light it and run***" then our firefighters could very well be showing up at your house ... followed by a visit from our police officers!

Between the ever-shifting coastal winds and the currently dry conditions, it's just not worth risking your dream home, family cottage, or worse yet a rented vacation property.

Finally, don't forget the safety and common courtesy to your neighbors. Remember, **there's no need to go lighting off "the good stuff"** – just leave it to the professionals! Trust us, your neighbors (and their pets!) don't need to see your brand of "midnight patriotism" on display, courtesy of your trip across state lines and thousands of dollars in additional credit card debt.

And before using the excuse of "**it's for the kids**" remember that **20%** of the nearly **16,000 annual firework-related** injuries are to children. The last thing you want to give your kids is a trip to the Emergency Room.

This summer, save your time and money ... and possibly even your neighbors' roof! Go check out the amazing shows offered by Oak Island and surrounding communities, where the only thing you have to setup is a your favorite beach chair!
