


The next holiday closure will be on **Monday, November 11, 2024** for **Veterans Day**.

NEW Garbage & Recycling Cart Request Options

Whether it's for a new residence or old rental, a big home or small cottage, there's one common denominator for all properties in Town ... everyone produces trash! With literally **thousands** of garbage & recycling carts collected every week in Oak Island, it's a common need to repair broken carts, or replace ones that have gone missing altogether.

Garbage & Recycling Collection services for Oak Island are contracted through **GFL Environmental, Inc.** After working out the details with the Town's **Public Works Department** for several weeks, the Department is excited to announce **a more direct way of requesting new or replacement carts.**

There are now several options for requesting carts, based on the specific need, including:

- **Carts that are damaged or go missing on their Service Day**
- **Carts that go missing on days OTHER than their Service Day**
- **Carts for a New Resident, New Construction, or Additional Carts**

Utilities Notice: Water Change to Chlorine

(**NOTE:** This notice is provided by [Brunswick County Public Utilities](#))

From **October 26, 2024** through **November 2024**, Brunswick County Public Utilities will use **free chlorine** as the primary disinfectant, as part of the **Annual Flushing Program**.

During the program, Public Utilities employees flush the water mains by opening fire hydrants and allowing them to flow freely for a short period of time. During the flushing, **a slight change is made in the water treatment process**, transitioning the disinfectant used from **combined chlorine** (in the form of chloramines) to chlorine in an uncombined state, commonly referred to as **free chlorine**.

The annual change from chloramines to chlorine for this brief period **is required by the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality**.

Customer Service Window Closure

On **Wednesday, October 30, 2024**, the **Customer Service Desk** windows at several Town Facilities will be **CLOSED** until **2:00 PM** to accommodate employee training.

This includes the

- **Utilities & Tax Payments Desk** on the first floor of Town Hall at 4601 E Oak Island Drive.
- **Permitting Services Desk** at the Development Services Department, also in Town Hall.
- **Recreation Department Front Desk** in the Recreation Center at 3003 E Oak Island Drive.
- **Public Services Building** (Public Works / Utilities) at behind the Community Center at 113 SE 48th Street.

This training will be focused on improving the efficiency and user experience for customer service, which will better serve the residents and utility customer of the Town of Oak Island. Limited emergency assistance will be available as needed, however **all routine transactions are heavily encouraged to be done prior to or after this closure.**

Manager's Message: Beach Nourishment Update

From the desk of Town Manager, Kathryn Adams...

Summer is over, Fall is in full swing, and Winter is fast approaching; and for the first time in nearly two years, we'll use the Winter months for some crucial beach nourishment efforts.

In case you missed the **Administrative Reports** during last week's Town Council meeting, we were able to provide some exciting and encouraging updates on the status of our upcoming ***Beach Nourishment Project*** for the 2024-25 Winter Season.

As reported during the meeting, the lease for available sand from the **Bureau of Ocean Energy Management** (BOEM) is expected soon, which is required to proceed with the project. Additionally, the ***Bid Documents*** were prepared, with the project set to go out for bid this week on October 15. The bid openings will take place on **November 5, 2024 at 11:00 AM**. This is encouraging news, as for now it keeps the Town on schedule for starting this current nourishment project; which itself plays a crucial role in our long term Beach and Inlet Management Plan.

FIRE: Ocean Rescue: Season Report

While Labor Day may mean the "end of Summer" for some, the season doesn't officially end for our **Ocean Rescue Unit** (ORU) until October 1. While we still maintain staff at the Fire Stations during the "off season" in case of emergency, the on-beach patrols have ceased until next Summer.

During last week's **October 8 Town Council Meeting**, Chief Lee Price was joined by ORU members to give a detailed Season Report. From July 1 - October 1, the ORU assisted or directly responded to:

- **17 Ocean Rescues**
- **6 Ocean Assists**
- **14 EMS Calls (on the beach strand)**
- **3 Missing Persons Calls**
- **32 Marine Incidents**
- **15 Self-Rescue Assists or Other Response Incidents**
- **5 Standby Events**
- and **180+ Ocean Safety Education Opportunities!!**

That last one, "***Safety Education***" is key! While out on patrols, our vehicles were stopped constantly to ask questions about everything from current conditions, or explaining the Beach Warning Flags, or even to give advice on spotting rip currents. Each time, we counted that as a major "win" for safety. Any efforts to help educate beachgoers on how to enjoy the ocean safely and responsibly, means one less person we might have to be called to save later.

Once again, THANK YOU Oak Island for helping to make this program and our efforts possible. We have worked hard to build this program to help better serve this community, and the numbers now show the results.
