Brunswick Utilities Switch Back To Chloramines

PLEASE NOTE: The information below is provided from the **Brunswick County Public Utilities Department**.

On October 26, 2024, the Brunswick County Public Utilities Department began its annual Disinfection Changeover and Flushing Program. During the past month, Public Utilities crews have worked to flush water mains and distribute **chlorine** throughout the County water system.

Starting on November 25, Brunswick County will convert back to Chloramines as the primary disinfectant, flushing will continue through December.

Depending on your location within the distribution system and usage patterns, it could be two to three weeks for your drinking water to transition from free chlorine to combined chlorine. If taste and/or odor problems persist, please contact the Brunswick County Public Utilities Department or your local water provider.

NEW "Friends Of Stormwater" Awards

This past **Thursday, November 21**, the Town's Stormwater Administrator, Brice Taylor was joined by Environmental Advisory Committee Chair Margaret Johnson, and Town Council Member Bill Craft to present three (3) local businesses with the first-ever **Friends of Stormwater Awards**.

Developed earlier this year, the *Friends of Stormwater* awards seek to identify and celebrate local businesses for their positive stormwater initiatives over the previous year and beyond. The initial recipients were selected due to their use of innovative stormwater-friendly materials, and include:

- Haag & Sons Seafood
- Lil & John's Sweetreat Homemade Ice Cream
- Solar Brewing Company



These businesses were specifically recognized for the use of *pervious materials* in their parking areas. Unlike *impervious pavement* which is more commonly used, pervious materials allow water to flow through it and back into the soil, further reducing stormwater runoff into the streets. As the region continues to grow and develop, it is important to recognize such leadership in stormwater management, and inspire future commitment from businesses within the community.

SAFETY BRIEF



FIRE: Holiday Cooking Safety

Did you know Thanksgiving is the **peak day** of the year for **home cooking fires** -- with more than *three times the daily average*? As we approach the Thanksgiving Holiday, the Oak Island Fire Department wants to wish everyone a happy **and safe** season.

Between the activity in a bustling kitchen and the distractions of family and loved ones, lighthearted situations can quickly turn serious. Whether your turkey is a "deep fried delight" or an "original oven roasted" it's important to remember some basic safety tips when cooking this season.

- **Never deep fry indoors**, and this includes underneath an elevated (on pilings) home. Always use an open area away from any trees, structures and/or vehicles. (and by all means, make sure the turkey is **completely thawed, defrosted, and dry** before placing in hot oil).
- **Stay in the kitchen** when you are cooking on the stove top so you can keep an eye on the food.
- **Keep children away from the stove** - at least three feet away to avoid burns or sharp objects.
- **Keep the cooking area clean** and free of dangling cords from countertop appliances.
- **Keep the floor clear** so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- **Be prepared for choking hazards**, through learning **rescue techniques**, and considering adding choking rescue devices such as a Life Vac or Dechoker.
- **Most importantly: make sure your smoke alarms are working!**

Remember, if the worst happens and you do have a fire, they can spread quickly. Do not be embarrassed or afraid to **call 9-1-1 FIRST**. POLICE: Holiday Travel Safety

While our colleagues over at the **Fire Department** are concerned about your safety in the kitchen, we'd like to address those of us who ***let others do the cooking***, where all you have to do is ***just show up!***

It's no secret, Thanksgiving is the busiest travel time of the year, and for 2024 more than **132 million people** are expected to hit the highways. If you find yourself behind the wheel this week, try to avoid the peak travel times and follow these tips from our friends at the **American Red Cross**:

- Make sure your car is in good condition for a road trip.
- Pack an emergency preparedness kit, supplies and a first aid kit in your vehicle.
- Share travel plans with a family member or friend.
- Check the weather before departing and along your route.
- Be well rested and alert.
- Buckle up, slow down, and don't drive impaired.
- Follow the rules of the road and use caution in work zones.
- Give your full attention to the road and avoid distractions.
- Make frequent stops during long trips, and rotate drivers if possible.
- If you have car trouble, pull off the road as far as possible.
