

PROJECT OVERVIEW





FEASIBILITY STUDY PURPOSE



Determine Federal interest for coastal storm risk management (CSRM) in Oak Island for a period of 50 years. This is a reformulation of the existing Federal project. The Recommended Plan must be technically feasible, economically justified and environmentally acceptable.

Brussels County Beaches (Oak Island Portion) Study:

1966: Rivers and Harbors Act (PL 89-789) – Authorized the Brussels County Beaches Project for hurricane-flood control protection from the Cape Fear River to the North Carolina-South Carolina State line of which Oak Island, NC is a separable element over a ten-year project life from project construction.

1976: Water Resources Development Act of 1976 (PL 94-587) – Extends periodic beach nourishment up to 15 years.

1986: Water Resources Development Act of 1986 (PL 99-662) – Extends periodic beach nourishment up to 50 years and specifies the cost sharing requirements for additional feasibility Studies.

2019: The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 (PL 117-328), authorizes the Government to conduct a General Reevaluation Study of the Oak Island Portion of the Brussels County Beaches CSRM Project.




Post-Renourishment

TENTATIVE UPCOMING ACTIONS

1. USACE Receive a signed letter of intent – 15 March 2023
2. Negotiate and Execute the Feasibility Cost Share Agreement – 13 June 2023
3. Receive Funds (\$500,000) from Non-Federal Sponsor – 28 June 2023
3. Hold first public information meeting within first 12 months of study
