- Police, Fire, and Emergency Response services will be available by **calling 9-1-1**



Salty Dog Park Closure

On **Tuesday, December 3, 2024**, the **Salty Dog Park** located within the **Bill Smith Park** at 4410 Fish Factory Road will be **CLOSED** to accommodate the removal of a dangerous tree. Work is anticipated to be completed and the park reopened by early afternoon.

Community Survey Reminder

REMINDER: The **Community Engagement Survey** as part of the **2045 Charting The Course** project will **CLOSE** this coming **Saturday, December 7**.

This survey is a critical opportunity to provide input on the Town's effort to update the existing **CAMA Comprehensive Land Use Plan** (often referred to as a "Comp Plan"), as well as the simultaneous **Streetscape Project**.

HWY 133 Closure Notice

**NOTE: This notice has been provided by the North Carolina Department of Transportation. For more information, visit the NCDOT website or contact NCDOT directly.*

To improve water flow, a portion of **River Road (N.C. 133)** will **CLOSE** for several months, requiring a detour. The road near **Funston Road** will **close to traffic December 2** and reopen in late summer 2025. **[EDIT (12/5/2024): Signs, including "road closed" and "detour" were not in place as scheduled by a contractor, so for safety reasons the N.C. Department of Transportation could not close the road. The project is still planned to begin this month, and the department will provide another update when a new date has been selected for implementation of the road closure and detour.]**

During the closure, N.C. Department of Transportation contract crews will replace a drainage pipe with a larger aluminum pipe, as well as multiple other pipes with a 388-foot bridge and culvert. Drivers should follow the signed detour to N.C. 87 and U.S. 17 to access either side of River Road. NCDOT encourages drivers to plan their route as it will take longer than normal and use caution near the construction sites.

Individuals can also enjoy social/recreational (bingo, rummikub, etc.) activities while attending the site from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM, with other special programs listed on the monthly calendar.

SAFETY BRIEF



FIRE: Home Heating Safety

While a "White Christmas" in Oak Island may refer more to sand than snow ... the holiday season has definitely come in strong this week, with some of the earliest freezing temperatures we've seen in recent years.

Whether the cold comes in waves or settles in to stay, we'd like to remind everyone of some important tips for home heating safety.

Space heaters, fire places, and other supplemental home heating are a great and economical way to help stay warm, but they **must be used cautiously**. When using these items, remember to:

- **Have the device or fireplace inspected annually to ensure they are operating optimally**
- **Never leave fires, space heaters, candles or other means of heat unattended**
- **Keep combustibles, pets, and kids 3-5 feet away from heat sources as these generate enough heat to burn, melt or ignite such items**
- **Be sure to verify that you use the right fuel for the right device**
- **Place heaters on a solid flat surface to prevent from tipping (most newer models can detect a tilt and safely disable the device, but it's always better to err on the side of caution!)**
- **Plug supplemental heaters directly into the outlet on the wall, and NOT with an extension cord**

Additionally, some great advice that's worth following all year long, is to **regularly make sure your smoke detectors are functioning**, and have fresh batteries. A "best practice" would be a simple test once a month, or at a minimum of twice a year. Adjusting clocks for daylight savings time can usually serve as a good reminder.

POLICE: Preventing "Porch Pirates"

As we are now well into the gift giving (and buying) season, more than 90% of shoppers will buy at least some of their holiday gifts online; with almost half of ALL shoppers buying only online. While home delivery makes shopping convenient for you, it can also makes things convenient for criminals too.

This holiday season, let's remember to "**keep pirates in the past & off your porch!**" To help make sure your gifts end up in the right hands, try these tips:

- **Use "Delivery Instructions" to have packages left in a discreet or secure location**
- **Require a signature or (if possible) other means of remote verification**
- **Install motion activated security lighting**
- **Considering adding a doorbell camera**

Most importantly, remember to simply be a good neighbor. The holidays can be a stressful time, and delivery drivers are human too. Mistakes happen. With streets named by number AND direction here in Oak Island, we often see packages delivered to the wrong houses (ex: a "NE" address instead of "NW" street, etc.). Taking a few minutes to make sure an incorrectly delivered package gets to the right home could make all the difference in someone else's holiday. Even "Santa's Helpers" need a little help sometimes!
