Town Hall Renovations Begin

"Pardon our noise" ... or is it "dust" ... "paint fumes" maybe? Either way, as of **Monday January 6, 2025** visitors to the Town Hall will notice some serious work taking place, as construction has begun on the **Town Hall Renovation Project**.

As pictured below, the project will reposition the Tax and Utility Payment windows, as well as the Development Services Permitting desk within the front lobby. This move will help make these services more accessible to the public, while also improving building security.



The work should be completed in about one month, and work areas will be closed off with appropriate signage as needed. NOTICE: Brunswick Nuclear Siren Test

(Contributed by Duke Energy)

This coming **Wednesday, Jan. 8, 2025**, the **outdoor warning sirens** around the **Brunswick Nuclear Plant** will be **TESTED** between **10:00 AM** and **11:00 AM**. This is **ONLY A TEST**, and **no public action is required**.

The 38 sirens within 10 miles of the Brunswick Nuclear Plant will sound at **full-volume** for five to 30 seconds. To ensure they are functioning properly, it may be necessary to test some sirens more than once. Follow-up testing after siren maintenance may be required after 11:00 AM.

Testing is performed in cooperation with emergency officials in Brunswick and New Hanover counties, who are responsible for sounding the sirens. Because this is a test, local broadcasting stations will not interrupt regular programming to broadcast Emergency Alert System (EAS) messages. If there was ever a real emergency at the plant requiring the sirens to be sounded, local radio and television stations would broadcast information and instructions to the public.

Matt Kirkland has been working in local government for approximately 15 years, with a specific focus in planning for nearly a decade. Before joining Oak Island he served in nearby Leland, the fastest growing town in North Carolina. With Oak Island being in close proximity to such significant growth, Kirkland has been highly instrumental in helping to navigate the challenges that come with regional change.

As Development Services Director, Matt will administer the **four key divisions** within the **Development Services Department**:

Hydrant Replacement Begins

Starting this week, the **Public Utilities Department** will begin work on the **Hydrant Replacement Program**. The goal of this program is to **replace 25 fire hydrants per year**, beginning a long-term rotational period that ensures the Town will always have modern, reliable hydrants.



Currently the Town maintains over **800 fire hydrants**, with 776 of those being on the Island portion alone. Every year, all 800 must be inspected, with full testing completed on 20% of the hydrants per year. This ensures that every hydrant is inspected yearly, and goes no more than 5 years without full testing. The **Hydrant Replacement Program** now adds to that effort, by established a set schedule for their uniform replacement.

Over the next few weeks, if you see crews from the Public Utilities Department working on a hydrant, please treat them just as you would a firefighter performing hydrant testing and **do not** approach them to ask questions, as this can slow down the process.
