This Week: Tree Trimming Class

On **Wednesday, January 15** beginning at **NOON**, the Stormwater Permitting Division will be hosting a **Tree Trimming Class** with **Certified Arborist, Todd Stevenson**. The class will be held in the Police Department Training Room, located on the 2nd floor of the Police Department at 4621 E Oak Island Drive (beside Town Hall). A field demonstration will be conducted immediately following the classroom instruction, with the entire course expected to last until 4:00 PM.

The Town's Tree Canopy Manager, Brice Taylor is excited to host Mr. Stevenson as the guest speaker, as he provides guidance on **Proper Techniques for Pruning Trees**, a crucial step in ensuring their healthy growth and continued development. Todd Stevenson is the owner of **Total Tree Care, Inc.**, located in Myrtle Beach, SC. He is a member of the **American Society of Consulting Arborists**, and certified through the **International Society of Arboriculture**, providing consultation services in South Carolina, North Carolina, and Georgia.

Ending Soon: Grinding of The Greens

This coming **Saturday, January 18** will be the **FINAL DAY** to dispose of live Christmas Trees as part of the **Grinding of the Greens** program. The collection station is available in the the **Middleton Park Complex parking lot** at 4610 E Dolphin Drive.

Provided by the Public Works Department, the program offers a convenient and environmentally beneficial way to dispose of live Christmas trees, which are ground up and used as mulch in various Town parks and facilities. **Remember, all decorations must be removed before dropping off your tree!**

Oyster Shells Disposal Safety

Speaking of disposal options, the Public Works Department was recently made aware of oyster shells still being discarded near the garbage and recycling carts in Veterans Park, at 1504 E Yacht Drive.

The Department realizes this may be due to lingering confusion, or simply "old habits" from the early days of Veterans Park (*originally named Waterway Park*) when the Living Shoreline project was first started there. While the NC Department of Environmental Quality notes that recycled oyster shells are valuable resources in the state, used to build new oyster reefs, such a program no longer exists at Veterans Park.

Although well-intentioned, it is important to note that **Veterans Park is NOT a collection area for oyster shell disposal**. Additionally, **oyster shells are banned from disposal in North Carolina landfills** and cannot be used as groundcover by landscape contractors. The good news is that there are multiple Oyster Shell Drop-Off Sites within Brunswick County, even as close as neighboring Southport.

Manager's Message: Budget Season Begins

We are now just two weeks into a new year, but we have already kicked off one of the most important times in local government ... **Budget Season!**

The development of an Annual Budget is a process that operates on a near continual basis, where each month's revenues are analyzed to help project next year's budget. However, the most visible portions of the process begin with the Town Council Retreat this Thursday, leading into the following schedule:

- **JANUARY:** During the annual Town Council Retreat (**this Thursday, January 16**), the Council sets the goals and priorities for the coming year.
- **FEBRUARY - MARCH:** The Town Manager and Finance Director work closely together with department directors to identify capital and operating needs, as well as potential cost-savings.
- **APRIL:** The Town Council hosts several "Budget Workshops" in which the Town Manager and Finance Director present the needs and priorities of all departments and services. The Town Council provides directives on where to increase or decrease spending for the final draft of the Recommended Budget.
- **MAY:** The Town Council holds a special meeting in which the Recommended Budget for the coming fiscal year is formally presented to both the Council and the public. This releases the Recommended Budget for public review before a **Public Hearing** is held to receive input from residents.
- **JUNE:** Town Council must adopt the new Budget by June 30.

The best part of this schedule is **YOU** get a **front row seat to every part!** All publicly held workshops, special meetings, and public hearings are open to the public, and will be broadcast on OKI-TV, as well as livestreamed on the [**Meetings Information**](#) page.

Leading The Way In Drone Safety

On Thursday, January 9 and Saturday, January 11 the Oak Island Fire Department hosted the **Reading Smoke & Using IR Thermal Cameras** training course in Fire Station #2 at 8510 E Oak Island Drive. While the *Reading Smoke* curriculum has been around for many years, this class was distinctly different, as it was focused on **drone use**.

First responders representing the drone units for nearly a **dozen** different agencies in the police, fire, and rescue fields, all came out to learn about applying existing techniques to new technology.



This course utilized the Town's innovative **Drone Unit** as part of a larger curriculum for public safety being developed in-house by the Town's **Chief Public Safety Drone Pilot, Shawn Barry**. The coursework Barry is developing has been approved through the Law Enforcement Drone Association (LEDA), and is being taught in partnership with Brunswick Community College.

The Reading Smoke adds to the **three (3) courses** being taught in this Spring semester, which also includes **Basic Public Safety Drone Pilot** in February and **Water Rescue Skills & Techniques** in March.

The innovation and leadership the Town of Oak Island has taken with incorporating drone technology into our public safety is being **recognized on a national level**. The Town Administrative staff, along with the Fire and Police Departments, continue to proudly promote the work done by Chief Drone Pilot Barry and the entire team who operate these valuable life-saving tools everyday.
