Customer Service Area *Now Open*

Over the past two months, frequent visitors to the Oak Island Town Hall may have noticed some serious work taking place, and not just in the regular office spaces. As reported in the **January 6 edition**, the new year brought new changes and a new look to the first floor lobby, as construction began on the all new ***Customer Service Area***.

As seen in the time lapse video above, the project repositioned the ***Tax & Utility Payment*** windows, as well as the ***Permitting Center*** for Development Services. All of which are now conveniently housed right in the first room of Town Hall. This move helps to make these services more accessible to the public, while also improving building security.

The completion of the new Customer Service Area further extends the latest commitment to improving customer service, which in 2024 began with the addition of a front desk receptionist position. The previous window areas will now be converted to much-needed office space for new and existing staff. The remaining portions of the project, including renovations for the old areas should be completed in March.

NCDOT Launches State Transportation Improvement Program

The N.C. Department of Transportation is inviting the public to provide feedback on the **Draft 2026-2035 State Transportation Improvement Program** (STIP). The STIP is developed under the **Strategic Transportation Investments law (STI)**, which established the **Strategic Mobility Formula**.

As part of this effort, NCDOT will host **regional drop-in sessions** ([see this flyer](#)) across the state between **February 17 and March 17, 2025**. Feedback from these sessions will also help shape the development of the **2028-2037 STIP**. Additionally, a **Public Comment** period is now open through **April 4, 2025**.

After the public comment period concludes, NCDOT will review and address all comments. Feedback will be shared with the Board of Transportation and the Final 2026-2035 STIP is expected to be approved by the Board of Transportation in **Summer 2025**.

2024 Police Department Annual Report

Last week, during the **February 11 Town Council meeting**, Police Chief Charlie Morris presented the Town Council with the **2024 Police Department Annual Report**.

As Chief Morris noted in his presentation, the Annual Report provides a "snapshot" of what goes on inside and outside of the Department. The Report features 40 full-color pages of information, from the **Mission Statement**, to a **Traffic Summary**, **Crime statistics**, and **Department Goals**.

Having a thorough, comprehensive report presented annually is important to maintaining Department transparency; which is a vital part of the Community Policing model we strive for. Whether it's through the **Chief's Message** on page 6, or the **Staff Organizational Chart** on Page 8, this report gives you the information you need to know who serves your community daily.

Flying High & Leading The Way

Back in the **January 13 edition**, the Oak Island Fire Department announced new public safety training courses, utilizing materials developed through the Town's **Drone Unit**. This is part of a larger curriculum for public safety being developed in-house by the Town's Chief Public Safety Drone Pilot, Shawn Barry.



The courses continue this week, as the Fire Department hosts the first **Basic Public Safety Drone** course in Brunswick County. This three day, 24-hour training will provide regional public safety drone pilots with the basic skills needed to safely operate a drone with their agency.

PLEASE NOTE: Aerial training will be conducted in public areas throughout the following week ahead.

The coursework Barry developed has been approved through the Law Enforcement Drone Association (LEDA). The innovation and leadership the Town of Oak Island has taken with incorporating drone technology into our public safety is being recognized on a national level.
