Fake Facebook Event Scam

Did you notice that disclaimer, in the Tree Naming Contest article above? The one about how it does **NOT** include any prizes or promotional offers? Yeah, that's because sometimes the world of social media isn't a nice place.



This past **Sunday, February 23**, the Town of Oak Island's Facebook page was subject of a pretty aggressive scam attempt, as seen in the attached screengrab below. In this attempt, the recent Tree Naming Contest post was "cloned" by a scammer, who used the copied information to create a fake Facebook Event, in an attempt to trick users into clicking on a fictitious link.

It's important to note that this was entirely separate from the official Town page, and was NOT the result of a hack or other intrusion. The attempt was reported to Facebook. Please remember, the Town of Oak Island has not, and **WILL NEVER send links or direct messages through Facebook**.

Thank you to the community members who also reported the attempt. If you have clicked on any links, or feel you may have been a victim of this scam attempt, it is recommended to check your account and change any associated passwords. NEW Social Media Survey

Adopt-A-Highway Volunteers Needed

For many visitors and part time residents, the magic of Oak Island really starts to hit well before they cross the trestle bridge. In fact, part of the beauty of Oak Island can be found along the roads leading to, in, and throughout the Town.

That's why the **Environmental Advisory Committee** (EAC) is seeking your help, in their latest call for volunteers to join the ***Adopt-A-Highway Pick Up Team***.

Volunteers within the group meet quarterly in January, April, July, and October, to pick up trash and debris on the sponsored streets in Oak Island. Last year they collected **over 300 pounds** of trash, improving the environment and helping keep our Town clean.

New Week, New Scam

Between the the fake Facebook event page mentioned above, and the "Missed Court Date Fine" scam we reported on [earlier this month](#), it seems there is no shortage these days of unscrupulous people trying to take advantage of others. With all of the competition out there to try and scam folks, you would almost think it would be easier to just make an honest living ... *but the attempts persist*.

This week, we have been alerted to a recent trend, whereby scammers send fake **Parking Penalty Charge** notices through a text message. These messages try to convince you of unpaid parking tickets, and pressure you to make immediate payments.

With the **2025 Paid Parking Season** about to start in just over a month, this is an important scam to keep in mind. **Remember, neither the Town of Oak Island nor the contracted parking services provider, Otto Connect will solicit for parking fine payment through text messaging.**

Always be cautious of anything that seems out of the ordinary, and always take a closer look at things that DO seem ordinary. If you ever have questions about a parking citation, contact the information directly on the ticket itself. For tickets issued by Otto Connect, just email surfcast@ottoconnect.us, and for citations from the Oak Island

Police Department, just use the contact form link on the back of the citation.
