Beach Day Events & Traffic Plan

For several weeks, the **Recreation Department** has been advertising the packed schedule planned for this year's Beach Day celebrations. Additionally the **Police Department** has also been working to share the **UPDATED Traffic Plan** ahead of the Fireworks Display capping off the day's events.



Now is **YOUR last chance** to help share all of the fun and informative graphics above! Please help these departments by sharing the these details on **activities**, **event registration**, and especially the **NEW TRAFFIC PLAN** asking everyone to exit the Island through Middleton Ave. / Swain's Cut Bridge.

While this route may be a slightly longer distance for some, it will make for **faster travel for all**, as it helps to avoid current traffic detours and construction on NC 211 / 133, and takes advantage of the shorter bridge and multiple lanes on E.F. Middleton Blvd.

Nourishment Project: Survey Work Notice

Starting on **Monday, July 7**, the ***Summer Beach Survey*** work will begin as part of the Town's upcoming **Beach Nourishment Project**.

Surveying contractor **TI Coastal Services** will be conducting the survey work, which will include operations on the ***land*** and ***water***. During the Survey, a truck with the *TI Coastal* logo and GPS equipment will be seen on the beach areas, while a small boat will be used for hydrographic measurements near the shore.



As pictured above, the survey boat will be clearly marked and may come close to shore during this process. **This is normal and not cause for alarm**; however, those fishing or swimming near the boat are asked to temporarily reel in their lines or move until the boat passes.

Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Launched

On **Thursday, June 19**, a kickoff meeting was held for the **2025 Update** to the **Southeastern NC Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan** (RHMP). Though probably a familiar term for most coastal residents, **Hazard Mitigation** is defined as *any sustained action taken to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from hazards*.



Last updated in 2021, updating the RHMP will help ensure all applicable counties and their municipalities remain eligible for various forms of federal pre-disaster and post-disaster hazard mitigation funding.

Garbage & Recycling Collection Notice

There are many "seasonal increases" Summer brings to this area, including seasonal tourists, seasonal revenues, and of course **seasonal Garbage & Recycling Collection volumes**.

Between the increases in traffic, collection volume, and outside temperatures, contracted service provider, **GFL Environmental** is reminding all customers that collection services **may take a little longer than usual**.

As crews continue to work hard through extreme heat conditions, please be considerate and help to make their job run faster. Make sure carts are neatly placed by the streetside, and no other materials are left outside of the carts (**as noted in the recently launched CURB ALERT campaign**).

REMINDER: Draft Land Use Plan Published

As first reported in last week's edition, the **DRAFT Comprehensive Land Use Plan** has been published and is now ready for public review!



As part of the [2045 Charting The Course](#) project to the **CAMA Comprehensive Land Use Plan** (often referred to as a “**Comp Plan**”), the **DRAFT Plan** is not final until voted on by the Town Council. A **public comment period** is available until **5:00 PM on Friday, July 25, 2025**.

Just through shares on the Town's **Facebook** and **X** platforms alone, these videos have garnered nearly **30,000 views** in less than a week.




