"Ramp Repair"

As of **Monday, August 4** repair work has been started on the damaged public **Boat Ramp** at **NE 55th St.**

IMPORTANT: While work on the ramp may **appear** to be near completion, additional work is still needed before it can be **reopened for safe public use**.

Currently, the ramp is anticipated to be reopened by next week; **until that time, the ramp remains CLOSED -- DO NOT move or cross the barricades to use the ramp**, as this can pose a safety hazard, and possibly delay work in progress, leading to longer closure times.

New Mobi-Mat Installed

As of **Monday, August 4** the **Mobility Assistance Mat (Mobi-Mat)** previously damaged in the Beach Access Location at **SE 40th Street** has been **REPLACED**. This had been removed last Monday (June 28) due to damage from vehicles driving illegally on the beach ([CLICK HERE to read the original notice](#)).

However, last week the **Public Works Department** was able to source an immediate replacement, which has since been successfully installed, allowing the access to be returned to service. The Town is continuing to pursue damage and compensation by the drivers of the multiple vehicles which led to the Mobi-Mat's destruction.

Dune Infiltration Project Update

An important update for those who live on or frequent Ocean Drive. The **Dune Infiltration Project** has marked a significant milestone in its 120 day construction schedule.

The Project's "infiltration" system, that is the portion which disperses stormwater within the dunes, has been **COMPLETED**. Starting later this week, the contractor will begin laying the storm drain pipe in the area of Crowell Street, which will divert stormwater to the infiltration system, and help reduce standing water on Ocean Drive.

First started on **June 16, 2025**, this project is the continuation of a successful system previously installed in 2023 / 2024 at nearby Barbee Blvd. Before being installed in Oak Island, a similar system was proven successful in neighboring Caswell Beach. As an added benefit, the installation will increase the width of the area's secondary dunes, providing additional protection to infrastructure.

Tax Notices Now Available Online

Some important news for home and property owners, the **2025 Property Tax Notices** are now available for download directly from the Town Website.

As a reminder, property taxes are due annually on September 1, with taxes having been paid on or before January 5 to avoid interest and enforced collection.

Individuals can also enjoy social/recreation(bingo, rummikub, etc.) activities while attending the site from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM, with other special programs listed on the monthly calendar.



SAFETY BRIEF



It's no secret this has been one of the ***busiest Summers EVER*** for the Town of Oak Island, and that holds especially true for first responders! While beachgoers naturally WANT to get on the sand as quickly as possible, it's important to remind one about our NEED to get on the beach even faster.



Usually the ***Emergency Vehicle Access*** pathways help with just that. Currently, **23 out of 65** of the Town's Beach Access Locations have been designated for Emergency Access, with features like a wider pathway and modified parking lot design to allow for emergency vehicles.

With lots of new visitors and even a few forgetful regulars, it's time for the important reminder to **"KEEP PATHS FREE, FROM STREET TO SEA!"** This includes equipment on the beach as well, as there have been several recent incidents where tents, chairs, and even people were placed right in the driving path on the beach side of the dunes.

For the **safety** of first responders, victims, and even yourself, please remember to take a few steps away from these pathways, and ensure you're not obstructing a potential rescue. The "Hole" Update

Last month the Town **announced a new Ordinance Update** which now limits the depth and tools used to dig recreational holes on the public beach areas. Deep holes in the sand can be *dangerous* to beachgoers, wildlife, and Beach Safety crews responding to emergencies.



To help raise awareness of these dangers and promote the ordinance updates, the Town launched the "**Goodbye To Deep Holes**" campaign. This aggressive marketing effort and your help to spread the word has really made a difference!

In the month of May, the Beach Safety Unit helped to fill **over 205** large, deep holes left unattended on the public beach areas. For July, we saw a more than **40% decrease** to just 130. We will keep up our efforts to reduce these numbers even further; but in the meantime, please keep sharing this vital information to help us *Say Goodbye to Deep Holes*.
