## Extensions Ended, Dozers Demobilized

On **Saturday, May 22, 2021** the final load of dredged sand was placed and positioned, as part of the **2020 / 2021 Nourishment Project**.

Initially scheduled to run from late February to early April, the project experienced several delays before sand distribution even began, resulting in on-beach activity not starting until April 8. In a rare occurrence, the NC Division of Coastal Management and the US Army Corps of Engineers, granted two separate extensions, to allow operations to continue beyond the start of Sea Turtle Nesting Season on May 1. This allowed for completion of the project area prior to the start of Hurricane Season, creating enlarged dunes and beach areas to help provide critical protection of property, wildlife, and infrastructure from potential storms.

**MOVING FORWARD.** Planting of vegetation along the newly constructed dunes will take place throughout the month of June. This planting will occur along the top and landward sides of the new dunes (*pictured*). This vegetation will serve the dual purpose of protecting the investment of these new dunes from natural threats like storms, as well as helping to deter unaware beachgoers from walking over them.

The next beach nourishment project is planned for the fall / winter of 2021 / 2022, following the end of sea Turtle Nesting Season in November. ## COVID-19 Response Updates

On Friday, May 14, 2021 Governor Cooper issued [Executive Order 215](#), which lifted COVID-19 restrictions to reflect new public health recommendations. This Executive Order went into effect on May 14, and will remain in effect through 5:00 PM on June 11, 2021 unless repealed, replaced, or rescinded.

According to a release published by the Governor's Office, the new Order reflects the latest Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People, which were published on May 13 by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC"). The Executive Order also cited state-level improvements, such as the fact that between April 25 - May 8, no counties in the state were rated to have a "critical" rate of COVID-19 community spread.

It was also noted that at the time of the Order, forty-six percent (46%) of the state's population over age eighteen (18) had been fully vaccinated, and fifty-one percent (51 %) of the state's population over age eighteen (18) was partially vaccinated; with over 7 million doses of COVID-19 vaccine having been administered throughout the State. Locally, vaccinations are still being provided through the **Brunswick County Health Services COVID Vaccination Clinic**.

## Progress for Pedestrians

Despite delays due to supply shortages for materials deliveries, the **Davis Canal Pedestrian Walkway**, connecting **SE 9th Street** to **9th PL E**, was opened just prior to Memorial Day weekend, as anticipated in the most recent project update.

Repairs to the SE 9th Street Walkway called for replacement of just under 50% of the structure. This included over 300ft of walkway, replacement or repair of 30 piles and 15 pile bents, and replacement of the floating dock and gangway.

As noted in previous updates, work has now commenced on the Walkway connecting SE 20th Street to 19th PL E, with a completion currently expected to take about a month, depending on weather and materials availability.

The Public Works Department reminds everyone that the top priority for the remaining project is to ensure a **SAFE** environment, both for the public and crews working in the area. Please do not interact with any equipment, or try to converse with workers onsite. Be sure to give crews needed space to perform their duties. ## Beachside Bike Racks

Even if "pedal power" isn't your preferred method of transportation, there's a good chance you may have noticed lately, some new hardware at your nearby Beach Access Location. On **Sunday, May 20, 2021**, Scout Michael Ryan Prince of Southport Troop 38 (*pictured*) finished his project for the rank of **Eagle Scout** by installing 6 new bicycle racks at Oak Island beach accesses. Funds for the project were raised by Prince, who oversaw building the racks this past winter, using plans developed for the Oak Island Beach Preservation Society.

Ryan selected the project as a way to help serve the community through contributing to the access amenities normally provided by the Beach Preservation Society. The project serves a two-fold purpose, both providing parking for bicyclists, as well as honoring the life of his grandfather, William Thad Proctor. To this effect, the rack placed at SE 49th Place bears a plaque in Proctor's honor. Other racks built for the project will replace structures lost to Hurricane Isaias in August 2020.

For the Eagle project, a Scout is required to demonstrate leadership by coordinating the efforts of others to serve a community goal. Oak Island's Public Works Department marked areas for bike rack placement in advance of the installation. New Scouts Chasen Sharp and Nicholas Moore along with more experienced members of Troop 38, Owen and Ethan McLaughlin, Josh Alanis, and Ryan. The Oak Island Beach Preservation Society, Inc., is grateful that Ryan chose to offer his service in this way!

## Mosquito Management

With June and the summer month comes sunshine, beautiful days ... and the eternal enemy of fun outdoors, the mosquito! The Town of Oak Island maintains trucks specifically for mosquito management through chemical spraying. The Town typically starts mosquito spraying operations in June; however, NC EPA standards must be met before they can begin, such as recorded heavy rain events or a large area of complaints.

The Town's trucks are equipped with Smart Flow Technology, providing the driver with increased treatment flexibility, and improving the accuracy of each application. Areas are sprayed based on federally mandated criteria, provided under the Town's pesticide licensing. The chemical used is identified as an organic oil, named Biomist 3+15 ULV.

It should be noted that the application of insecticides during routine spray operations is always delivered in methods approved by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Applications are made at concentrations which are either very diluted, or at Ultra-Low Volume (ULV) rates, and are not done very frequently for any given site. In real world use, these application conditions have allowed the EPA to scientifically conclude that when all product label language and instructions are followed, use of mosquito control insecticides “poses no unacceptable risks to human health, wildlife or the environment.”

Typical spray times are between 6:00 PM - 11:00 PM, Monday - Thursday, across four (4) Spray Zones. Two zones are sprayed each night, with two nights needed to complete entire island. The spray travels approximately 300 ft. and only kills mosquitoes that fly through it while it is in the air.

As a precautionary measure only, people and pets should go indoors when they see the mosquito sprayer coming. ## Community Center to Reopen


In the early responses to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Oak Island Community Center was closed to help prevent the further spread of Coronavirus. Located in the heart of Town at Middleton Park (4701 E Oak Island Drive), the Center has been a staple of community life and social interaction among all ages of the Oak Island community, but especially the senior population.

Following recently updated guidelines from federal authorities, as well as the latest Executive Order from Governor Roy Cooper, a reopening for the Community Center has been planned for the week of June 7.

Due to current staffing levels, the Center will initially open with **limited functionality**, with hours of operation tentatively scheduled for **10:00 AM - 2:00 PM**. Additionally, the Center is still awaiting a health inspection from Brunswick County Health Services, before the nutrition program providing meals can restart. An inspection is anticipated by the end of the same week, and packed lunches will be allowed to be brought into the Center in the meantime.



Whether it's to fish, golf, exercise, pick up a new hobby, or simply relax by the ocean, it's no secret that one of the main reasons folks come to Oak Island is to have FUN! It's also no secret that the Town of Oak Island has one of the most successful, robust Recreation Departments in the State of North Carolina. The dedication, commitment, and overall creativity of this amazing team, allows them to regularly serve more than 87,000 residents and visitors each year, through the many programs and services they provide.

From social clubs and athletic leagues, to educational services, and even community-wide events (*can you say "Summer Concert Series?"*) the Recreation Department's efforts can be seen on almost every street in Town. Providing services and programs that interact with almost every age group available as well. In fact, the information related to the Recreation Department takes up over 1/3 of the information searched for on the Town Website!

**PROFILE:** *Recreation Director:* Rebecca Squires leads the staff and volunteers of the Department. At times the staff can seem more like a crew of well-trained gymnasts, than municipal employees. Constantly flexing and adjusting themselves to meet the deadlines and demands of providing as many programs as possible, Squires leads from the front in being just as accessible as any of her staff.

Coming to Oak Island from the Parks & Recreation department of Graham, NC, Rebecca has spent the last 18 years serving the residents and visitors to Oak Island. It's that ratification of a job well done, that has driven Rebecca Squires throughout her full and productive career in recreation management. It's also given her cause to see the benefits in enjoying recreation for oneself.




