Paid Parking End of Season Report

During last week's Town Council meeting on **November 12**, the **2025 End of Season Report** on Paid Parking was presented by Jim Varner of the contracted service provider Otto Connect.

Note: Some of the information contained in this report is taken at a point in time and will change over time as additional payments are made.

Highlights included the report of Net Revenues totaling \$1,313,831, a significant increase from last year at \$1,191,838. This comes despite a slight (4%) decrease in the total number of vehicles parked, at 166,152 in 2025 versus the 172,718 in 2024.

Where does the money go? The distribution of revenues from Paid Services are designated by the Town Council as part of the yearly Budget process.

Currently, the Town Council has established a **percentage split**, with 15% to remain in the Parking Fund for maintenance of the parking areas (signs, bumpers, gravel, etc.), and the remainder transferred to the General Fund “*to offset costs to taxpayers.*”

As for the amount transferred to the general fund, that is represented in the pie chart on [**Page 17**](#). It is important to note that the Paid Parking Season is April – September, which spans across fiscal years beginning on July first.

Beach Nourishment: Dredging Begins

As of this past Saturday, **Sea Turtle Nesting Season** has officially ended in the Town of Oak Island. With that end comes the beginning of the highly-anticipated **2025 / 2026 Beach Nourishment Project**.



NOTICE: Starting late evening on Thursday, November 20 the *Dredging & Sand Placement* operations for the project will begin. As a **reminder**, the parking areas on **SE 49th St.** for the Kevin Bell Skatepark and the adjacent Beach Access Location are now **CLOSED**, to allow for equipment placement and project staging.


It is important to note that **work will be conducted 24 hours per day**, which will include **noise, moving machinery, ground vibrations, and closed beach areas**. To ensure the safety of everyone, please be sure to **respect the boundaries of any closed staging or construction areas**, and **do not distract crews onsite by attempting to speak with them or ask questions**.



Last week, the **Police Department** conducted multiple staff trainings focused on "Active Shooter" response and Workplace Safety & Security. While this is a very standard training for most workplace settings these days, we are proud of the fact that this training was conducted entirely in-house by our own **Sgt. Kristy DeMello** and **Community Resource Officer Joseph Trahey**.



Not only do we strive to keep the community of Oak Island safe, but we also want to keep our employees of the Town safe as well. In this training, they discussed what **to do** or **not to do** when faced with an "active shooter" event in the workpl

Beach Safety Season Report

Last week we talked about the start of **Beach Bonfire Season**, but before we get too far into the Fall, there's a final piece of business from the Summer to address. During the **Town Council meeting** last week, Fire Chief Lee Price gave the **2025 Beach Safety Season Report** providing season data from the **Beach Safety Unit** (BSU).



The report touched on the consolidation and restructure of the Town's **Ocean Rescue** and **Beach Services Units**, and how they provide an enhanced service level for residents and visitors on the beach areas.

That enhancement shown through in the numbers, as for 2025 the BSU provided "**Safety, Education, Response, Enforcement**" of:

- 566 Dogs Leash violations
- 196 Sand Dune Violations
- 809 Deep Hole "discussions" (615 Holes directly filled)
- 75 Glass Container Warnings
- 750 Emergency Access Blockages
- 1,176 Rip Current Education Contacts

With these daily interactions, plus the more than 30 estimated Rescue Tube uses, it was certainly a busy Summer for Beach Safety. **While numbers like these can make the beach seem like a dangerous place, it's just the opposite!** The increased efforts of BSU staff have worked to create a safer, better observed beach for everyone.



But remember, safety starts with YOU! Scanning the QR codes to view the Beach Warning Flags, and learning how to recognize and respond to Rip currents is important. 
