## Town Council Actions Review

This past **Tuesday, December 9** the Oak Island Town Council held its regular meeting in the Council Chambers, located on the second floor of Town Hall at 4601 E Oak Island Drive.

## Beach Nourishment Update

This week, the **2025 / 2026 Beach Nourishment Project** marks a full month since on-beach operations began back on **November 21**.

**IMPORTANT UPDATE • ADDITIONAL SAND APPROVED:** As noted in the **Council Actions Report** above, Council approved the placement of an additional **114,000 cubic yards of sand**. This was made available due to a **Coastal Storm Damage Mitigation Grant** in the amount of **\$3M**. This additional sand will be placed in the areas of **SE 43rd St. to SE 52nd St.** and from **2nd Pl W to 3rd Pl W**. Beyond this noted addition, the project has already placed over 255,000 of the 941,000 cubic yards provided in the Base Contract.



**NOTE:** Work on the **Wilmington Harbor Project**, which will provide sand to the eastern portions of the Town's beach area, continues to progress on schedule as well. Sand placement in neighboring Caswell Beach continues, with the project expected to reach Town Limits at the McGlamery St. Beach Access Location by early January, 2026. Once this operation reaches the Town Limits, it will be reflected on the **Progress Tracker** map, located on the **Beach Nourishment Project** page.

## Sidewalk & Crossings Update

Following a soggy start over the first weekend in December, **Phase I** of the **Commercial Area Sidewalk Improvement Project** gained (or rather, "**paved**") much ground over the past week. So far the project added approximately **900 linear feet** of **NEW** sidewalk on the North side of E Oak Island Drive as it works from **NE 46th St.** to **NE 56th St.**

Once the sidewalk is finished, construction will begin on the NCDOT approved **Pedestrian Crosswalk** featuring a **lighted crossing signal** at the intersection of **E Oak Island Dr.** and **NE 51st St.**



This new sidewalk and pedestrian crossing are expected to **greatly improve pedestrian safety** in one of the busiest areas of Town, and will be joined by future pedestrian safety enhancements to come.

**REMINDER:** While construction is underway, there may be periods of **noise, dust, moving machinery**, and **temporary access restrictions** to streets and parking lots in the area. **Please drive cautiously through these work zones, and pay attention to any traffic controls onsite!**

## Lunch & Learn Success

They say one of the best ways to get to know somebody, is to share a meal together. This past **Friday, December 12**, that's exactly what happened when more than **60 contractors, builders, and developers** came together for the 2nd Annual **Lunch & Learn Contractors Workshop**.

This workshop invited members of the local building community for an in-person training on the latest updates to regulations and ordinances for Stormwater Management and Tree Preservation.



Over the past year the Town has made several significant advances in tree management, as well as improved regulations for managing stormwater runoff from construction sites. The Workshop provides a crucial meeting point for Town staff and builders to come together and learn about changes, discuss impacts, and even address frustrations with any further improvements that may be needed. All with the ultimate goal of promoting responsible growth that helps to preserve our environment and tree canopy.

## Grinding Of The Greens Returns

While the Christmas season may have just begun for some, there are other observers who've been watering their Christmas trees since **Spooktacular** ended. Regardless of when the trees were first trimmed, the **Public Works Department** will be there to help when it's time to take them down.

The annual **Grinding of the Greens** program will once again be available, starting on **December 26** and running through **January 16, 2026**, with collection area in the **Middleton Park Complex** parking lot at 4610 E Dolphin Drive.

This program provides a convenient and environmentally beneficial way to dispose of live Christmas trees, where after collection they are ground up and used as mulch in various Town parks and facilities. For those participating, please **remember to REMOVE ALL decorations** before dropping trees off.



**DO NOT leave trees on the beach / dunes or burn trees as part of beach bonfires!**
