

Survey Says ... Improvements Made

From November 10 - 30, the Town of Oak Island invited residents and visitors to participate in the Second Annual **Customer Service Survey**, as part of the Town's ongoing efforts to improve the customer experience in Town Hall and all other facilities.

Well now, the results of the survey are in, and thanks to **YOUR** input over the last year, some positive changes are starting to show!



As noted in the graph above, The 2025 Customer Service Survey reveals consistently strong satisfaction with Town staff across all major service areas, with an overall **satisfaction score** of **4.12** (out of 5). This year's Survey showed a **significant improvement** from the first year, where the Survey showed an overall score of **just 3**.

The actions taken to improve the customer experience over the past year are a **DIRECT RESULT** of the feedback given in the first Survey back in 2024 ... **and their success is showing!**

Of course this isn't all just a one big pat on our back. The survey reveals there are still some important **areas for improvement** as well. With a **3.94 score**, is revealed some work is still needed in the area of **Accountability**. While a score solidly falls within the "Good" range, showing the Town's day-to-day customer service behaviors are reliably strong, the Town will working to strengthen follow-through and speed of service moving forward.

Beach Nourishment Update

Important Note: Work on the **2025 / 2026 Beach Nourishment Project** will continue through the Town's holidays closures. This will include **noise, moving machinery, ground vibrations, and closed beach areas.**

To ensure the **safety of everyone**, please **respect the boundaries** of all **closed areas**, and **DO NOT** distract crews onsite by attempting to speak with them or ask them questions. The **Project Information** page will continue to be updated on a regular basis.



Upcoming Work: As noted last week, **an additional 114,000 cubic yards of sand** has been added to the project. For the week ahead, crews have returned to work in the area of **SE 43rd St. to SE 52nd St.** to place this additional sand. After placement has been completed at SE 52nd St., crews will **return to the area of 9th Pl E** and continue working WEST.

Additionally, work on the **Wilmington Harbor Project** is expected to reach Town limits at the McGlamery St. Beach Access location by next week (January, 2026). Once this operation reaches the Town Limits, it will be reflected on the **Progress Tracker** map, located on the **Beach Nourishment Project** page.

Nuclear Siren Test

[NOTE: This notice is provided by Duke Energy, for more information visit duke-energy.com/NuclearEP]

On **Wednesday, January 7, 2026** between **10:00 AM - 11:00 AM** Duke Energy and county officials will perform a **Five - to 30 second quarterly test** of the sirens around the Brunswick Nuclear Plant.



No public action is required. This quarterly test is performed to ensure the sirens are functioning properly. Sirens will sound for five to 30 seconds, and anyone who hears a siren **during scheduled testing does not need to take action.**

- During testing, some sirens may be tested more than once. Follow-up testing after siren maintenance may be required after 11:00 AM.
- Because this is a test, local broadcasting stations will not interrupt regular programming to broadcast Emergency Alert System (EAS) messages. If there was a real emergency requiring the sirens to be sounded, local radio and television stations would broadcast information to the public.

Grinding Of The Greens Reminder

Christmas is officially on Thursday, and for some punctual partakers, that means the their live Christmas trees will come down first thing on Friday!

Thanks to the annual ***Grinding of the Greens*** program, tree collection will once again be available starting this **Friday, December 26** and run through **January 16, 2026**, with a collection area in the **Middleton Park Complex** parking lot at 4610 E Dolphin Drive.

Organized by the Public Works Department, this program provides a convenient and environmentally beneficial way to dispose of live Christmas trees, where after collection they are ground up and used as mulch in various Town parks and facilities. **REMINDERS:** please **remove ALL decorations** before dropping trees off, and **DO NOT** leave trees on the beach / dunes or burn them as part of beach bonfires!

Travel Safely; Celebrate Responsibly

We know the next couple of weeks will be **BUSY**, so let's get right to the point with some **important annual messaging**:

FIREWORKS. Pretty, but problematic. We get it, sometimes people just like to send out the old year with a bang! However, as a general "rule of thumb" please "try to keep your thumbs" and avoid fireworks which **explode or fly up into the air**, as those is illegal in the state of North Carolina.

Sharing an island space where houses are close together, we've sadly seen the results of what happens when this isn't followed. **Also prohibited** are fireworks such as firecrackers, roman candles, bottle rockets, and things that spin on the ground, and can result in a Class II misdemeanor.

To us however, it's about so much more than just following a set of rules, it's about **SAFETY and the protection or property**. If you're knowledge of operating an aerial firework is to simply "*light it and run*" then there's a good possibility our fire engines could be showing up at your house **or your neighbors!** So please, be considerate of yourself, of others, and even their pets. Leave the New Year's Eve pyrotechnics to the professionals.

Speaking of considering others ...

DRUNK DRIVING: DON'T DO IT! It's a simple as that.

Regardless of whether you're celebrating a new year, or just getting through a holiday dinner with your crazy cousins ... don't make 2026 the worst year ever for you or someone you love.

Remember that "***buzzed driving IS drunk driving!***" Being even slightly impaired isn't just taking a chance on your skill, it's forcing everyone else on the road to take a chance on you as well.

If there's even the slightest concern of impairment, then please ***use a taxi, friend, or ride sharing*** service to get you where you need to go. This is the season to celebrate with the ones you care about. Don't let one set of poor decisions steal that opportunity from you or others.


