Class Is Back In Session

It's one of the biggest announcements to signal a new year in the Town of Oak Island, and one of the most important programs every resident should participate in ... the **2026 Oak Island Citizens Academy** dates have been announced, and **applications are now being accepted!**



Citizens Academy is an interactive program designed to educate and familiarize residents with the departments and services provided by their local government.

Citizens Academy returns for 2026 even **BIGGER** and **BETTER** than ever! Now featuring a total of **TEN (10) individual classes**, held on **Tuesdays & Thursdays** in the months of **February** and **March** (unless otherwise noted). Through hands-on class learning and field demonstration, this course helps to provide a deeper understanding of the "**who, why, & how**" government operates at the municipal level. The program also serves to encourage stronger participation in local government, from residents of all interests.

Important Meeting Changes

One of the first "orders of business" for any new year is to set the dates for "conducting business" ... at least it is for the **Boards & Committees** which make up Town government.

While most of these groups have elected to keep the same schedules, **there are some notable changes for 2026:**

- **PLANNING BOARD** will begin a new meeting schedule with regular meetings held on the **FOURTH Tuesday** of each month at **6:00 PM**, and the first meeting of 2026 scheduled for **Tuesday, January 27** at **6:00 PM**. Meetings will still be held in the Town Council Chambers, located on the second floor of Town Hall at 4601 E Oak Island Dr.
- **TOWN COUNCIL** will **continue** to hold regular meetings on the **SECOND Tuesday** of each month at **6:00 PM**; **however**, the meeting for January has been **MOVED** to **Tuesday, January 20, 2026**. Additional schedule changes to the **2026 Meeting Dates** were also **approved by the Town Council** during the December 9, 2025 meeting.

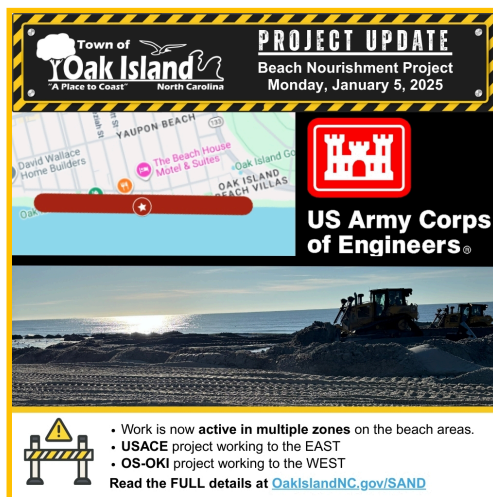

Beach Nourishment Update



IMPORTANT: Construction activity for the **2025 / 2026 Beach Nourishment Project** is now active in multiple work zones throughout the entire public beach area.



This means that machinery and equipment, as well as closed Beach Access Locations and beach areas can be seen in several locations, as the US Army Corps of Engineer's (USACE) **Wilmington Harbor Project** has begun work at the eastern area of the Town limits (McGlamery St.), adding to the work on the **Oak Island Off-Shore (OS-OKI)** project, currently in the area of **25th Pl W**.

Both of these operations are reflected in the **Progress Updates & Map** map provided on the **Beach Nourishment Project** page.

To ensure the **safety of everyone**, please **respect the boundaries** of all **closed areas**, and **DO NOT** distract crews onsite by attempting to speak with them or ask them questions. The **Project Information** page will continue to be updated on a regular basis.

Live Tree Collection Reminder

At this point, Christmas seems like something that happened ... well, **last year!** But if you're still squeezing every last drop of Christmas spirit out of your spruce pine, that's okay too.

As a reminder, the annual **Grinding of the Greens** program will still be collecting live Christmas trees until next **Friday, January 16, 2026**. The collection area is located in the **Middleton Park Complex** parking lot at 4610 E Dolphin Dr.

Organized by the [Public Works Department](#), this program provides a convenient and environmentally friendly way to dispose of live Christmas trees. After collection the trees are ground up and used as mulch in various Town parks and facilities. **REMEMBER:** you **must remove ALL decorations** before dropping trees off. Additionally, trees **CANNOT** be left on the beach / dunes, or burned as part of beach bonfires!

Find The Shells = Fill The Holes

In case you are unaware (or you missed the first section of this newsletter), the Town of Oak Island is currently undertaking a massive **Beach Renourishment Project**. For most beachgoers, that means ***avoiding*** the noise and moving machinery of the work areas. For others however, it means actively ***seeking out*** these areas, as they are hunting for the "treasures" providing by the dredged sand.

Those sea treasures including everything from ***shells*** to ***sand dollars***. It is true, the sand taken from the ocean floor for beach nourishment can often provide a bevy of nautical decor; **but as with any popular activity, shell hunting must be done responsibly.**

Recently the **Fire Department**, along with year-round members of the **Beach Safety Unit** have been working to fill in large holes left on the beach, which were created by shell hunters digging for shells and leaving the holes behind.

Over the past several weeks, as word of the favorable conditions for "shelling" has spread on social media, the number of holes being left behind has become an emerging issue.



Last year, the Town did pass an **update to Ordinance 14-142**, which limits the depth of holes and the tools used to dig them. However, **even shallow holes can be a danger to wildlife, beachgoers, and first responders who may not see them.**

Beyond safety, it's also about simple common courtesy and respect. If applying the old adage of "*leave it better than you found it*" then there should be no problems, especially considering it takes much less time fill in a hole than to dig one!

So please, if you find yourself out shelling in the near future, ***don't let your treasure hunt become someone else's traumatic experience ... fill in all holes!***
