Right-Of-Way Updates

Last week, during the **January 20, 2026** Regular Meeting, the Town Council voted to amend **Section 26-1** of the Code of Ordinances, regarding personal items and uses within the Town Right-Of-Way (ROW) and enforcement of ROW violations.

While the exact width of a ROW varies based on the specific street, the ordinance revisions create **new standards** for personal items and uses, **based on distance from the edge of pavement**. These standards are divided into TWO zones, identified as "**WITHIN 10 feet**" and "**BEYOND 10 feet**" from the edge of pavement, before the start of personal property.

RIGHT-OF-WAY UPDATES: NEW INFORMATION YOU NEED TO KNOW

During the January 20, 2026 Regular Meeting, the Oak Island Town Council voted to amend Section 26-1 of the Code of Ordinances, and adjust enforcement of Right-of-Way violations.

WHAT HAS CHANGED?

This update clarifies the allowed Items & Uses based on the **distance from the edge of pavement** up to the Right-Of-Way limit (start of personal property):

- **WITHIN 10 feet:** All currently permitted Items & Uses, including Mail & Newspaper Boxes, Driveway Connections, Mulch, Gravel, Streetside Parking (where applicable), Temporary Sporting Goods, Ground-Level Landscaping
- **BEYOND 10 feet:** Temporary items and vegetative landscaping up to 3' high
- **Unimproved ROW (street ends):** Limited to driveway connections and "Temporary Sporting Goods" which can be moved by hand

Additionally these updates now:

- **ALLOW** Town Staff to approve **ROW Encroachment Agreements**
- **ALLOW** vegetative landscaping installed prior to **July 18, 2025**
- **PROHIBIT** Permanent Structures including permanently installed fencing (retaining walls necessary for structural integrity can be granted a **ROW Encroachment Agreement**) and **Hardscape Landscaping** (above ground level) within 10 feet of the edge of pavement

NEW TOOLS ADDED

A **NEW Right-Of-Way Widths Map**, along with **Charts** and **Graphics** showing common examples of Items & Uses allowed in the ROW are now on a dedicated page of the Town Website!

Additionally, these updates also address the areas of public street ends, known as *Unimproved ROW*, limiting them to only allow driveway connections and temporary sporting goods.

Beach Nourishment Begins Final Push

The **2025 / 2026 Beach Nourishment Project** continues with sand placement throughout **multiple work zones**, as both the **Wilmington Harbor** and the **Oak Island Off-Shore (OS-OKI)** projects begin drawing to a close this week.

If progress continues at the current pace, on-beach operations for the **OS-OKI** project should be **concluded this week**, while the USACE wraps up the **Wilmington Harbor** project by **early next week**.

Once sand placement has concluded, it will still take a couple of weeks to fully demobilize equipment and reopen any closed Beach Access Locations. the meantime, **it is more important than ever to keep the safety of everyone as a top priority!** Please **respect the boundaries** of all **closed areas**, and **DO NOT** distract crews onsite by attempting to speak with them or ask them questions.

Cold Danger Reminders

While this past weekend seemed to thankfully spare us from an extreme wintry precipitation, it's important to note that **WINTER is NOT over yet**. As noted on the [**Storm Response Information**](#) page, the forecast for the week ahead calls for **dangerously cold temperatures**.



The **Oak Island Police Department** reminds everyone that as overnight and even daytime temperatures struggle to get above freezing, some real safety concerns will emerge.

TRAVEL in and around the immediate area may become hazardous, as standing water re-freezes each night creating black ice. **BRIDGES** will also ice over before roadways, so even if travel within Town is possible, regional travel may be limited.

Our officers and Public Works staff will continue to monitor conditions and keep updates on the Storm Response page. In the meantime, please remember that ***personal experience and driving skill DO NOT determine public safety!*** If you are visiting from, or previously lived in an area that routinely responds to winter weather, travel in this region may still be different and dangerous from what you are used to! Do not assume local road conditions and other drivers are similar to what you have previously experienced.

Home Heating Safety

If you head the words of OKI-PD above and avoid unnecessary travel, chances are you'll be at home perched in front of some kind of ***heating source***. That's why the **Oak Island Fire Department** and our partners at the **National Fire Protection Association** (NFPA) offer some important ***home heating safety reminders***.



When heating your home this winter, remember to:



- Have the device or fireplace inspected annually to ensure they are operating optimally
- Never leave fires, space heaters, candles or other means of heat unattended
- Keep combustibles, pets, and kids 3-5 feet away from heat sources as these generate enough heat to burn, melt or ignite such items
- Be sure to verify that you use the right fuel for the right device
- Place heaters on a solid flat surface to prevent from tipping, at least 3 feet from anything that can burn
- Plug supplemental heaters directly into the outlet on the wall, and NOT with an extension cord

Additionally, some great advice that's worth following all year long is to regularly check smoke detectors, to ensure they are working and have fresh batteries. A "best practice" would be to test once a month, or at a minimum of twice a year. Adjusting clocks for Daylight Savings Time can usually serve as a good reminder.
